


Message from the President:

CNNA Membership Drive

Our 7th year started on Oct. 1, 2008 and at this time we have about 121 members. When we regrouped the association in 2002, we had over 200 members that first year, so you can see that our membership has dropped off. Please remember that the CNNA is a **non-mandatory** association so we're not going to tell you what you can or can't do but we will try to help enforce city codes which means keeping fences fixed, houses painted and non functioning vehicles off the street. Our dues are only \$25 per year and it's well worth it when you get the benefits of our Home Depot discount coupon as well as the many other benefits we have negotiated. We keep our perimeters mowed and many think that's a simple thing but keep in mind that if you house backs up to either Hefner Road or Rockwell then you own that piece of property on the other side of the fence and it's your responsibility to keep it mowed. Many people don't realize this so the association chose to pay to have it mowed so it would always look nice. The trees on that piece of property also belong to the homeowner and they should be kept trimmed, as the association simply can't afford to maintain them. The CNNA membership fee is a small price to pay to help your property retain value. Spring Clean Up - THE BIG EVENT

Spring is upon up and it's time to get out and clean up our perimeters. As many of you may have noticed our perimeters are in need of attention. We have tree limbs on the ground and hanging from trees, fences are down (which is against city code) and we have a lot of trash that has accumulated over the long winter. We will be participating the The BIG Event this year by partnering with the University of Oklahoma. Each

year they host this event and will be sending a group of able bodied OU students to Canyon North to help us clean up the mess around our neighborhood. As many of you know, the perimeter of a neighborhood is the first thing that a potential new neighbor notices. If we want our property values to be the highest they can and if we want to have good neighbors moving into Canyon North we must do all we can to keep it clean. Please take one hour of your time and volunteer to help supervise these students. We'll be on the perimeters on **Saturday, March 28th**, from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon, so put on your work gloves and go to either the Rockwell or Hefner sides of the neighborhood. We'll be meeting at Trudie Burns' house, 6600 Evergreen Canyon Rd. if you'd like to start at 9:00a.m. We look forward to seeing you.

CNNA Annual Garage Sale

With Spring just around the corner it's time to not only clean up the outside of your house but the indoors as well. Clean out all that stuff you haven't used in years and make money selling it at our annual neighborhood-wide garage sale, **April 24-26**. The CNNA sponsors this event by advertising in the Oklahoman that weekend and we will be putting up our big yellow banners at each entrance the week before so people driving by will plan to attend. If you need some extra cash, and who doesn't right now, plan to participate.

If you plan to have a sale, you will need to contact the City to get a permit number. This is a simple thing to do. If your utility bill is in good standing with the City, the easiest way to purchase a permit is by calling **297-2606**. The **\$7.00** charge will be added to your bill. Your permit number will be given to you over the phone and must be posted at the sale location. Each household is allowed two garage sales annually. The sale must be held between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. and each permit is good for three consecutive days. Garage sale signs are not allowed on utility poles, traffic sign poles, medians or in the City right of way.
