



Covenant Violations

If you observe a covenant violation and want to report it, remember that all complaints **must be submitted in writing**.

Correspondence should be addressed to the Board of Directors and mailed, faxed or emailed to Signature Management Services. Please Note: Anonymous letters or calls will **not receive a response**. After receipt of your letter, the Association Manager will investigate to confirm that it is an actual violation. If the complaint is confirmed, an initial "warning" vioation letter will be sent to the homeowner responsible for the violation. The Management Company will follow up to confirm that the violation is corrected within the allotted time frame. If the violation is not corrected in the allotted time, the Management Company will follow the Policies and Procedures for the Enforcement of the Governing Documents that was adopted by the Board of Directors.



AUTOMATIC PAYMENTS

If you are busy like most of us these days, finding time to write out monthly bills can be cumbersome.

If you want to have one less worry trying to remember to pay your monthly dues on time to avoid late fees, you may want to think about having your assessments taken out of your bank account on a monthly basis?

<u>Lawn Care/ Dog Urine</u>: You may notice yellow spots in your lawn, most often the result of the nitrogen content of dog urine, similar to when the lawn is over fertilized. Female dogs tend to cause more damage because they usually empty their entire bladder in one place and saturate that spot on the lawn, whereas male dogs tend to "mark" areas of the lawn by lifting their leg. Dog urine is very high in nitrogen, and it is similar to pouring liquid fertilizer on the lawn.

What to do if the damage is already done?


You have to replant your grass; it won't come back on its own. First dilute the caustic urine from the soil by rinsing the area with the hose. Add a half inch of new soil to help absorb any remaining urine. Then you can spread new seed, or use a commercial yard patch mixture (available at most nurseries) or sod if this is a large area. The secret to good germination is keeping the seed moist and keep the area moist until the new grass is about 3 in. high. **Recovery time:** 4-6 weeks. **To avoid burning....**

- 1. Soak your pet's favorite areas in the lawn to get the salts out of the root zone before they kill the grass.
- 2. Fertilize your lawn in the spring to boost the overall color and mask the darker green dog spots.
- 3. Train your pet to urinate in a designated area. Replace or repair the grass in this area annually or cover it with mulch
- 4. Keep your pet well hydrated to make its urine less concentrated.
