





Attacking Neighborhood Nuisances

Los Angeles has the largest, and arguably the finest program of any city in the nation for combating neighborhood nuisances. But there is another very powerful and unique option that was also revealed at the past Congress of Neighborhoods. It's a process through which neighbors can join together, gather evidence, confront the property owner, and if necessary, file actions in Small Claims Court. If the city is able to act quickly and effectively to resolve your nuisance, you may not need to use this new weapon. If you and your neighbors don't want to document the problems and risk public exposure, you may want to let the city do it all. But solutions that rely entirely on government can be bogged down by budget cuts, legal processes, and case overload. So having an another tool certainly can't hurt. Thankfully, Brian Biery, formerly the head of Pasadena's Neighborhood Connections office (their equivalent of DONE), volunteered to take time off from his new job to explain the program to the Congress attendees. Imagine the impact that a dozen or so neighbors, each filing \$7500 claims, would have on property owners who allow drug dealing or other nuisances to occur on their properties, especially because attorneys aren't allowed in Small Claims Court. About 85% of the cases have been resolved without going to court. That's the real goal. If any of the neighborhood councils decide that they are interested in utilizing the Safe Streets Now! program, the next step would be to conduct a training to prepare future facilitators of cases of neighborhood public nuisances. You may
