Start accumulating items you want to sell in the Four Seasons yard sale. An ad will be placed in the Courier-Journal and three yard sale signs will be placed at each neighborhood entrance a week before the sale. If you want to participate, just tie a yellow balloon on your mailbox.

Here are a few tips to get you started on having an effective and fun yard sale:

- Having the original boxes and instruction manuals for an item allows you to charge a little bit more.
- Put prices on everything. The price should be on top of an item, not on the bottom. As a general rule of thumb, price items about a third of what they would cost new.
- Clothes do not sell well unless it's baby/kids clothes. If you price adult-sized clothes cheap enough, it will sell regardless.
- Gang items together, such as "all books .25 each" or "any piece of clothes \$1.00", or "anything on this table .50". You also can offer the customers a deal, example: paperbacks .25 each or 5 for \$1.
- Make sure everything is clean and shiny and displayed nicely. Set up portable tables so buyers don't have to bend over.
- Have coins and small bills available to make change (a roll of quarters, a stack of twenty-five \$1 bills, and a few \$5 bills). A fanny pack works well so you can keep your money safe and always have it with you to give out change.
- Have batteries on hand so buyers can test items to see if they work.
- Have grocery bags available for sold items, newspaper to wrap breakable items and a calculator to total up purchases.
- Be willing to bargain, but be less flexible at the start.
- Promote expensive items creatively. For example, if you have a camera you want to sell, place the camera, lenses, etc together and perhaps a print out of the Amazon information page for the camera.

Remember, you can always go down on a price, but you can never go back up. Good Luck!

Things You Need To Know!

Burglary Crime Prevention Tips

To keep us safe, and our property protected, the Louisville Metro Police Department has tips for us to follow:

- Always lock your doors, windows, and secure sliding glass doors with some type of jam or security device.
- Have a trustworthy neighbor watch your place while you are gone, and do the same for them.
- Do not schedule a service call to your home without you being present. If you do, let a neighbor know that you are expecting a visit whether you are home or not.
- Install an outside motion detector light or leave an outdoor light on at night. CFL bulbs are very cheap to burn.

Banana Pudding (Low calorie)
