I do, however, encourage you to first speak with the property owner regarding the issue (sometimes that's all it takes!). Perhaps the homeowner is elderly or our economic climate has put him/ her in a position where

they are unable to afford routine lawn service. If that is the case, I'm certain there is a neighbor willing to help out in the short-term.



# Louisville Metro Police Crime Statistics May 2009

Overall criminal activity is down in Beechmont and Beat 6 overall compared with this time last year. I credit increased attention by area residents in securing valuables in their vehicles, not leaving their cars running unattended, and locking and securing their dwellings and garages. 4th Division Detectives have made several arrests over the last 2-3 months of suspects that live in or frequent the south end area. These arrests, coupled with the efforts of Beechmont residents, have reduced criminal activity overall.

4th Division, Beat 6 encompasses Beechmont as well as the areas around Southside Drive to the intersection of Southland. For the year to date compared with 2008, property crime is down 22%, and violent crime 10%. We have increased our block watch organizations during my time in the 4th Division, which helps reduce crime. If you are interested in forming a block watch for your street, please contact our Division Resource Officer, Shane Justis, at 574-7010.

The 4th Division once again wants to thank Councilman Johnson's office, which works closely with the 4th Division to supplement our resources with his Neighborhood Development Funds (NDF's), allowing us to conduct crime prevention canvassing and enforcement patrols targeting problem locations and trends in the Beechmont area.




