CRITTERS CORNER

WARNING: THE 90807 ZIP CODE HAS BEEN DESIGNATED AS **★ A WILDLIFE WATCH AREA — WRIGLEY COULD BE NEXT!**

Due to recent reports of increasingly aggressive coyote behavior, the Department of Fish & Game has recommended that neighborhoods in the flict. Animal Control Officers have already increased patrols in the morning and evening when covotes are most active and will be following-up with residents reporting incidents where coyotes have approached * adults in an aggressive manner or approached areas where children were present. Your help is needed to keep pets indoors and to remove attractants that draw covotes to the area.

★ What Does This Mean?

A Wildlife Watch designation is placed on a neighborhood or zip code to address the increase in human-wildlife conflict. This designation has occurred because reported wildlife incidents have reached Level 4 or above based upon the following criteria:

- Increase in wildlife on streets and in yards at night
- Increase in wildlife approaching adults and/or taking pets at nigh
- Wildlife on streets, and in parks and yards, in early morning/late afternoon
- Wildlife chasing or taking pets in daytime
- Wildlife attacking and taking pets on leash or near owners; chasing joggers, bicyclists, other adults
- Wildlife seen in and around children's play areas, school grounds, and parks in midday with children present
- Wildlife acting aggressively towards adults or children in midday

What Can You Do?

Aggressive wildlife will be removed by USDA and State Fish & Game, only if preventative measures have first been implemented by a community. Preventative measures have been proven to reduce or eliminate the number of human-wildlife confrontations. You must:

- Never allow pets to roam
- Never leave small children unattended
- Create an inhospitable environment for wildlife
- Remove attractants by keeping pet food and water indoors
- Keep trash cans covered and secured at all times
- Clear brush from around the house and pickup fallen fruit

How Will I Be Affected?

During this time, Animal Care Services will schedule increased enforcement activities in your neighborhood. State Fish & Game Department will be notified of Wildlife Watch designation and pre-existing reports of covote activity and workshop or assessment may follow. Other actions may include:

- Having an additional officer assigned to the area for patrol and assessment during reported high-activity times and locations and issues citations for violations.
- Issuing citations to residents for free-roaming dogs and cats (unaltered), as well as informing them about state laws regarding the feeding and harassment of wildlife.
- Canvassing of neighborhoods by License Inspectors to distribute education material, verify license and rabies information and issue citations for violations.

Officers will also collect reports regarding activity of wildlife and behavior of animal owners in designated area to share with county, state and federal wildlife agencies. This information will be shared with Police Department, Environmental Health (restaurant inspection), School District (neighborhood schools) to increase awareness patrols by these agencies.


How Do I Report an Incident?

Any incidents involving wildlife at Level 4 and greater (see list above) should be reported immediately to emergency services by calling 9-1-1. Residents are encouraged to report 🖈 all other wildlife-related incidents as described in Level 1 through Level 3 to Animal Care Services. This may be done in one of the following three ways:
