




As you may remember from the last newsletter, the funding for our lighting runs out this month. The money from the yard sale will keep these lights on until June and we hope to get grant funding in July.



A number of our neighbors have expressed a growing concern about speeding cars through our neighborhood.




This is a residential neighborhood where the established speed limit is 25 miles per hour.





Yard Art


Mike Kepko has been cultivating his densely growing yard of cactus and other arid landscape planting for the ten years he has lived on 15th Drive. For accent and definition he has used river rocks to surround some areas and outline the narrow path from the front porch to the street.

His warm smile, framed by grey and white whiskers, greeted me as a friend not as an unknown neighbor, when I stopped by to ask him about his yard late one afternoon. Here and there among the flowers, vines and stalks it was obvious that he had been hard at work in the mid-winter Arizona sun. A small host of newly-dug up Aloe Vera plants had been laid on their sides on his driveway. These weren't discarded plants but ones now available for transplant from his rich earth to some other garden space.

Several versions of my favorite succulent family, aloe, grow in abundance in Mike's yard, among them: Aloe Vera, Coral Aloe, and Aloe Barbadensis. As a desert rat who appreciates a good shade tree, I told Mike I admired the two well-tended mesquites on the north side of his yard. Though he too likes these trees, Mike allowed that they have been a bit disappointing because of their aggressive root systems and fast-growing foliage, which he hadn't antici-

pated. His preference would have been Desert Museum Palo Brea but he couldn't find one when he was ready to plant. Mike's Red Flax plants grew so enthusiastically one year, with their chorus of red flowers that strangers and neighbors stopped by to take pictures and talk to him about them. But when he planted more the following year, he found they needed more water than his drip system provided so they haven't done as well. Once he has adjusted the watering system Mike is going to put in Blue Flax, which will add a striking contrast to the Red Flax.

Mike's friends tell him "You have too much of everything in the yard," but he just smiles and keeps right on tending to his garden.



WE MUST BE VIGILANT

Feb 16th - I've had some great interactions with a lot of BelAir residents this month - via email, on the phone and in person. It makes me proud that there are people who are actively committed to making BelAir a safer place for everyone.

You too can take an active role in making BelAir safer. The most important thing you can do is to be vigilant and report what you see. Don't keep things to yourself or think that "someone else will take care of it." Unfortunately I hear from many neighbors that they don't want to get involved - they don't want to be a bother, to

their neighbors, the association, to Neighborhood Services or the police. That's the worst kind of thinking we can have! The reality is in today's world, the squeaky wheel gets the grease. Trust me, I know - calling repeatedly works!

Is your neighbor's house a blight? Are they running an unlicensed business out of their home? Trash in the yard that won't get picked up? Call Neighborhood Services at 602 - 262 - 4644. Vagrants camping in alleys or canals, living in someone's oleanders? Suspicious drug or vehicle activity? Loud music past 11 PM? Call the Phoenix Police Department's non-emergency line at 602 - 262 - 6151 and report anonymously.

Unfortunately the Police Department is stretched thin and they cannot maintain the presence in BelAir that they would like to when so many other neighborhoods are much worse off. We need to take responsibility and maintain vigilance. We can't barricade BelAir to keep people out (nor should we want to), but we can take action and ask others for help.




