





Minutes from the November meeting were accepted with a correction to the term expiration of Jim Matthew. It should be the year 2000. The financial report was accepted as submitted.

Newsletter - Bob McBane cannot deliver and pick up the newsletter from the printer. Sharon Barger volunteered to do this task for the Association. We have had a number of new people volunteer to deliver the newsletter. appreciate their willingness to help get the news out to the neighborhood.

Alley Lighting Project - The committee for the alley lighting has gone through the neighborhood and located existing light poles to place the lights on. They were able to accommodate the wishes of the neighbors for the most part. APS will be contacted for installation. The darkest areas of the neighborhood were given priority in the locating of the lights.

Spring Neighborhood Clean Up -The clean up will be held on Saturday February 19th at 7a.m. We are going to clean out the alleys in the neighborhood. The focus will be on the weeds and the grass in the alleys. We need all the help we can get to accomplish this project.

Announcements - The Board was reminded of the caroling that was done on December 23 in the neighborhood. Carol was asking about people that don't get out much so they would make sure to stop at their house.

The Squaw Peak Precinct had an open house on December 15th.

Meeting was adjourned 10:02am. The next Board meeting will be held on January 8, 2000. Please check with any Board member as to location.
