



COLUMBUS POLICE UNVEIL NEW INTERNET REPORTING SYSTEM

All residents are encouraged to complete the **Columbus Police Community Survey** at www.columbuspolice.org and submit it. It is anonymous, only takes a few minutes and our officers would appreciate your input. Thank you!

The Columbus Division of Police announces the implementation of a new online reporting system. The online reporting system, known as COPLOGIC, is a fast and simple way for citizens to file police reports. COPLOGIC will allow citizens with Internet access to file reports anytime, anywhere, without having an officer present. All information is securely transferred to the servers through an encrypted channel. Once the report is approved it will be saved as an official report and citizens will receive a copy of their report in PDF format. The following types of reports can now be filed online:

- Telephone Harassment
- ♦ Identity Theft
- ♦ Lost Property
- ♦ Property Damage
- Theft (Involving an amount less than \$3,000)
- ♦ Theft from a Motor Vehicle
- ♦ Attempted Theft of a Motor Vehicle
- ♦ Vandalism

The new technology allows citizens to file a police report without the hassle of waiting for an officer to show up at their homes or businesses. It will also save the Division of Police hundreds of man-hours every month. COPLOGIC has been operational since March 2009 and has accepted well over 400 reports. RUMPKE YARD WASTE AND TRASH CONTAINERS

Columbus encourages you to recycle yard-waste. Returning grass clippings to your yard and composting other yard waste can keep your lawn and garden thriving and beautiful.

The City has recently made changes to our procedures for yard-waste collection. A new subscription-based yard-waste collection service is available from Rumpke. Rumpke provides curbside yard waste collection services for City of Columbus residents on a subscription basis. The cost is \$49.50, paid in advance and non-refundable, for the 6-month season from mid-April to mid-October. The cost remains the same no matter when service is started



from mid-April to mid-October. The cost remains the same no matter when service is started. Residents may sign-up at any time. A second 6-month season will run from mid-October 2009 to mid-April 2010 for \$49.50.

This new policy created a great opportunity to connect with our neighbors. Five of us neighbors pay only \$10 each for 6 months and set our yard waste **up to 15 bags a week** outside one of our homes on **Friday mornings for pick up**. So get together with some residents to arrange for your grass and leaves to be picked up. Make some new friends and save a few dollars.

How to sign-up:

- Call Rumpke at 1-888-786-7531. Payment is due at time of sign-up.
- ◆ Download sign-up form (see our website). Mail completed form along with payment to Rumpke.

Reminder: If you have not signed up for this service, please do **not** set yard waste bags out at the curb to sit all week. Residents want to see green grass and colorful flowers when driving down our streets, not the bags and trash containers at the curb. Thank you!





Thanks to all of you who recycle. You do a great job of getting your little baskets back off the curbs after pickup on **Fridays**.

The Trash collection day for our neighborhood is Ruby and is **Wednesday** until Labor Day. Thank you for bringing your trash can back away from the curb as soon as possible.



For **bulk pick up**, you must call 311. They will tell you what day to set out your items. Thank you for waiting until that time.

DO NOT BURN YARD WASTE

We have received calls about burning yard waste in the yards. Burning yard waste sends millions of spores aloft, causes breathing problems for individuals and it is prohibited by local ordinances.

LET'S PROTECT ADENA BROOK

No person shall place or dispose of in any manner any garbage, waste, peelings of vegetables or fruits, rubbish, ashes, cans, bottles, wire, paper, cartons, boxes, parts of automobiles, wagons, furniture, glass, oil or anything else of an unsightly or unsanitary nature on any state owned, controlled, or administered land, or in any ditch, stream, river, lake, pond, or any other watercourse, except those waters which do not combine or effect a junction with natural surface or underground waters, or upon the bank thereof where the same is liable to be washed into the water either by ordinary flow or floods.

The punishment for any of these violations could result in a court hearing, fines, or community service. These are considered a misdemeanor of the 4th degree.

If you see someone disobeying any of these infractions, please inform the person(s). If this doesn't work, please **call 311 or Anthony Fannin**, Solid Waste Inspector, at **645-7051** or **645-5466**.

PREVENTING WEST NILE VIRUS





One morning I placed my old telephones in a paper bag and set it in the middle of my driveway while going for my 7 am walk. When I came back to give it to my neighbor for their church garage sale, it was gone!

As the President's advisor on Homeland Security, I am passing along the following message from Kathleen Sebelius, Secretary of Health and Human Services, Janet Napolitano, Secretary of Homeland Security, and Arne Duncan, Secretary of Education, who are leading the efforts to prepare our Nation for the coming flu season.

Fellow Americans,

This spring we were confronted with an outbreak of a troubling **flu virus** called **2009-H1N1**. As the fall flu season approaches, it is critical that we reinvigorate our preparedness efforts across the country in order to mitigate the effects of this virus on our communities.

Today, we are holding an **H1N1 Influenza Preparedness** Summit in conjunction with the White House to discuss our Nation's preparedness. We are working together to monitor the spread of 2009-H1N1 and to prepare to initiate a **voluntary fall vaccination** program against the 2009-H1N1 flu virus, assuming we have a safe vaccine and do not see changes in the virus that would render the vaccine ineffective.

But the most critical steps to mitigating the effects of 2009-H1N1 won't take place in Washington — they will take place in your homes, schools and community businesses.

Taking precautions for this fall's flu season is a responsibility we all share. <u>Visit Flu.gov to make sure you are ready and learn how you can help promote public awareness</u>.

We are making every effort to have a safe and effective vaccine available for distribution as soon as possible, but

our current estimate is that it won't be ready before mid-October. This makes individual prevention even more critical. Wash your hands regularly. Take the necessary precautions to stay healthy and if you do get sick, stay home from work or school.

We are doing everything possible to prepare for the fall flu season and encourage all Americans to do the same — this is a **shared responsibility** and now is the time to prepare. Please visit Flu.gov to learn what steps you can take to prepare and do your part to mitigate the effects of H1N1.

CHILD BICYCLE HELMET LAW


The Columbus iuvenile helmet ordinance. legislated last year, goes into enforcement effective July 2009. It requires all under the age of 18 while riding a bicycle, skateboard, skates, rollerblade, &/or scooter, etc. within city of Columbus (on a street, sidewalk, trail, etc.) to wear an approved helmet.

Ord 0950-2008 adds the following language, which generally requires bicycles to be ridden "as near to the I right side of the roadway as practicable". Violations of I this section are an MM on the first offense, an M4 on the second offense within one year, and an M3 on the third offense within one year.

No person the age of one (1) or older but under the age of eighteen (18) shall ride as a passenger on a bicycle ! or non-motorized vehicle equipped with a firmly attached passenger seat or astride a regular seat on a tandem | bicycle, within the City without wearing a protective | helmet on the person's head, with the chin strap fastened under the person's chin. Such helmet shall be fitted to the size of the operator's head and shall meet or I exceed the standards set forth by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC).

No person, who is the parent, guardian, custodian, person having custody or control, or person in loco parentis of a child under eighteen (18) years of age shall authorize or knowingly permit such child to violate any provision of this division. Whoever violates division (B) of this section shall be fined no more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00). www.considerbiking.org


