* These will require further funding.


** Since Crime Watch has limited funding abilities, the Association must designate funds that are raised from dues. This would be an ongoing expense.

A light easy appetizer or meal

Tuna Cheese Spread

8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
6 1/2 oz. tuna, drained and flaked
1 cup chopped nuts, (blanched almonds are great)
1 medium onion, finely chopped
1/4 cup chopped parsley
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon hot pepper sauce, if desired (but preferred)

In small bowl, combine all ingredients, mixing well. Or use food processor only until blended. Garnish with fresh parsley, and serve with assorted crackers as an appetizer, or use as a stuffing in fresh ripe tomatoes on lettuce leaves. Umm good! Submitted by Virginia
