As we work to adopt the City's 2009-2010 General Fund Budget. the City Council will encounter the most difficult budget process ever. Public participation is vital as we move forward to set funding priorities for the City's fiscal year, which begins on the first of October. For that reason, I would like to invite you to participate in Budget workshops, meetings, and hearings. All workshops, meetings and hearings will be held at the City Chambers in the after-

noons. Budget Workshops are from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm on August 4, 11, and 18. and September 1 and 8. Lastly, the Budget Hearings are from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm on August 18. September 1, and September 8. To find out more information about the proposed budget, please visit www.longbeach.gov/district7.

Did you know the City of Long Beach hosts free movies at local parks? Pack up your picnic baskets and wrap up in warm clothing to enjoy a night with family, friends, and neighbors at our local parks. 

CRITTER CORNER

Response From Animal Care Services ...

Recently, we received a question from a WANA member regarding an incident that happened quite some time ago and was reported to Animal Care Services. Since similar problems have recently been reported in the area near Chestnut Avenue and 28th Street, she was wondering if policy had changed. While every situation has its own subtleties and specifics, we hope to respond appropriately to every situation to maintain public safety and the humane treatment of animals. Here is the question from our resident.

Dear Animal Care Services:

In the past, many of us who have complained about loose dogs killing cats appear to have been given very low priority. In one case, despite numerous complaints, two pit bulls dug under a common fence and killed a neighbor's dog -- a very large chow mix! The owner was told that nothing could be done about the dogs because the dogs never set paw on public property.

Loose animals, particularly those displaying aggression are considered a high priority for Animal Care Officers because they represent a potential public health or safety risk. Not only can stray dogs (and cats) bite or scratch people and their animals, but also cause traffic accidents, defecation and other safety risks. If you ever report a loose dog that is displaying aggression towards animals or people, **Animal Care Services strives to be there in 20 minutes or less.**

In this particular case, there is always something that can be done whether it is a violation of the municipal code and subject to criminal citation (enforced by the City Prosecutor) or a civil case initiated by the animal owners. Currently, there are changes to the municipal code that went to City Council on July 21, 2009 for approval that would amend the rules regarding off-leash to include the scenario above. Thus a dog that crosses property boundary (unwelcomed), could also be considered off-leash even though he never entered the public domain.


