St. James Cathedral school offers new class for 3- and 4-year-olds

St. James Cathedral School is now accepting applications for the 2009-10 school year. Its program includes a new three/four-year-old class, which provides a combination of a traditional curriculum and a Montessori curriculum.

The first half of the day consists of a traditional learning curriculum which provides a variety of academics such as pre-reading, language development, phonics, language arts, math, religion, science, and social studies. Opportunities are provided for hands-on activities and dramatic play. Children learn to respect, work and play with others in a positive Catholic environment.

Pre-kindergarten skills are presented for those who will be attending kindergarten the following year.
