

# MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT: Time To Make Sure You're In The Right Plan

(ARA) - Of the more than 45 million people relying on Medicare for health care coverage, many may be paying for a plan that doesn't meet their needs or is too expensive. However, Medicare annual enrollment, which starts Nov. 15 and ends Dec. 31, offers anyone with Medicare the opportunity to switch plans so that they're getting the most from their coverage.

"Many people don't understand they have a wide variety of choices when it comes to Medicare coverage and too few review their needs before re-enrolling each year," says Paul Gada, personal financial planning director for Allsup Medicare Advisor, an objective plan selection service that helps people understand and choose the most appropriate Medicare plan for their health care needs.

Individuals need to consider the following questions to evaluate whether they should switch plans before the enrollment deadline:

1. Will traditional Medicare or Medicare Advantage work best for me?

If you visit the doctor often and take prescription drugs, a Medicare Advantage plan may best fit your needs. If you only require routine medical visits and few prescriptions, traditional Medicare with a prescription drug plan may work best. From year to year, your answer to this question may change since your needs are likely to change.

#### 2. Do I need a supplemental plan?

Medicare supplemental insurance can help pay costs not covered under traditional Medicare. However, not everyone needs this coverage, including those who are eligible for Medicaid, have employer-provided group health insurance or have a Medicare Advantage plan.

3. Should I use Medicare instead of my private health coverage?

If you have coverage through a former or current employer, speak to the plan administrator before making changes. Consider comparing your private plan to your Medicare options, especially if your private plan is limited or the cost has increased significantly.

#### 4. Can I keep my doctors?

The majority of health care providers (doctors, hospitals, physical therapists, etc.) accept traditional Medicare. Medicare Advantage plans offer broad access, but this doesn't mean all doctors participate. Before joining a plan, determine if your doctor accepts it.

5. Does the plan cover prescription drugs?

Traditional Medicare doesn't generally cover medications

unless they're administered in the doctor's office or hospital. You have to enroll, usually at an additional cost, in a Part D plan for this coverage. Medicare Advantage plans, however, can offer prescription drug coverage.

#### 6. Are my drugs covered?

Each prescription drug plan has a list of drugs (formulary) that it covers. Drugs covered by a plan can change, so you need to review this list each year.

7. Are my prescriptions expensive enough that I could fall into the Medicare "donut hole?"

Medicare Advantage plans with prescription drug coverage and stand-alone Part D plans may have a coverage gap, sometimes known as the "donut hole." This means once you have paid your deductibles and the plan has paid its coverage - you'll have to pay the full cost until it reaches a certain dollar level. In 2009, this dollar amount was \$3,453.75. Only after this out-of-pocket amount is paid does Medicare begin covering costs again.

#### 8. How much will I have to pay?

Traditional Medicare may be inexpensive, but it comes with high deductibles. Medicare Advantage plans may have similar or higher monthly premiums, but offer a zero-dollar deductible and low co-pays; some also cap total out-of-pocket costs.

#### 9. Will the plan cover additional services?

Some Medicare Advantage plans cover dental, vision and health and wellness programs not available through traditional Medicare.

#### 10. Will I be covered while traveling?

Traditional Medicare provides coverage nationwide. Some Medicare Advantage plans restrict coverage to certain areas, but many offer out-of-network coverage for emergency care.


Reviewing your needs every year - especially with the experienced help of an independent Medicare plan selection service like Allsup Medicare Advisor - before annual enrollment is crucial to ensure coverage, Gada says.

"Medicare is like any other type of insurance; you don't want to be under-insured. But you also don't want to pay for things you don't need," Gada says.

## What to Take To Bed With You

This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator.: Put your car keys beside your bed at night.

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get into your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off by pressing the button on the key fob, or the car battery dies. It will work from most everywhere inside your house and it works whether you park in your driveway or in your garage.

Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and it requires no installation. Test it.

If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are the burglar/rapist won't stick around. After a few seconds, all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and the criminal surely won't want that.

And remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there.

It could also be useful for a medical emergency such as a heart attack or a fall. A person could activate the car alarm by pressing the panic button, and it could alert those in the area that there is a problem.

#### ZIPLOC OMELET



This works great!!! It's good for when all your family is together. The best part is that no one has to wait for their special omelet!

Have guests write their name on a quart-size Ziploc freezer bag with permanent marker.

Crack 2 eggs (large or extra-large) into the bag (not more than 2) and shake to combine them.

Put out a variety of ingredients such as: cheeses, ham, onion, green pepper, tomato, hash browns, salsa, etc.

Each guest adds prepared ingredients of choice to their bag and shake. Make sure to get the air out of the bag and zip it up.

Place the bags into rolling, boiling water for exactly 13 minutes [we did 15 minutes]. You can usually cook 6-8 omelets in a large pot. For more, make another pot of boiling water.

Open the bags and the omelet will roll out easily. Be prepared for everyone to be amazed. This is nice to serve with fresh fruit and coffee cake; everyone gets involved in the process and it makes a great conversation piece.

Imagine having these ready the night before, and putting the bag in boiling water while you get ready. And in 15 minutes, you've got a nice omelet for a quick breakfast!

### **Beneficial Birds**

Give birds a place to perch. Insect-eating birds do the most good when they are actually in your garden with the pests. Give the birds a perch in the middle of your seedlings and plantings where they can scope out the bugs. A piece of rebar bend in a u-shape works well. Just make sure it's as long as it is tall to keep cats away. Birds will also come into your yard when there is water available. An easy way to attract them is with a slow-dripping plastic milk jug. Punch a tiny hole in the bottom of the milk jug with a needle. Hang the water jug from a tree and place a saucer or birdbath underneath. The jug should empty in about two days, but the dripping sound will lure the insect-eating birds.



# **Thanksgiving Turkey Trivia**



Amaze your friends with your knowledge about the most popular bird during Thanksgiving.

Here are some interesting facts:

- ♦ As far back as 1000 A.D., Native American Indians raised turkeys for food. Aztec Indians in Mexico were raising them as early as 200B.C.
- Turkeys originally existed in the eastern US. and Mexico.
- The turkey industry grosses over \$1billion a year.
- ♦ The Average American consumes over 15 pounds of Turkey per year.
- ♦ Americans consume over 675 million pounds of turkey on Thanksgiving Day.
- ◆ Turkey, like poultry, is lower in cholesterol than beef an many other meats. The dark meat (thigh, legs,) contains more fat and cholesterol than white meat. So, that's why dark meat tastes so good!
- ♦ Male Turkeys are called "Toms", female turkeys are called "Hens" and baby turkeys are called "poults."
- ♦ Turkey eggs are tan in color and speckled with brown. They are about twice as large as chicken eggs.
- ♦ In 1947, the first Presidential pardon was ceremoniously given to a turkey.
- ◆ That long, loose skin that hangs down from a turkey's neck is called a "wattle."
- ♦ Sleepy after the big meal? Turkey contains an amino acid called "Tryptophan." Tryptophan sets off a chemical chain reaction that calms you down and makes you sleepy.

The wishbone is a tradition of Thanksgiving. Allow the wishbone to dry. Then, two people grasp each end of the wishbone. After making a silent wish, they pull it away. Whoever gets the joint portion, gets their wish.


#### Another Way to Cover Graffiti

Graffiti on a wood fence is a common problem, and they recommend you remove it promptly. The typical homeowner paints over it with a solid block of tan, gray, or brown, making a sharp rectangle in an attempt to be neat. Sometimes people cover subsequent graffiti with squares of different shades. We have all seen these patchwork fences. The graffiti has been removed but the fence is still defaced.

Krylon sells a can of spray paint called Camouflage Ultra-Flat, in Khaki (tan). Camouflage paint is intended to blend into natural underbrush and trees, and the khaki color is a close match for a weathered wood fence. If you spray mainly with the grain and feather it to blend the edges, you can cover graffiti and leave your fence looking very natural. I have used this on a long fence that was tagged with black, green, and red, and you would not know there was ever a problem.

Krylon camouflage paint will not blend with a new fence if the wood is still green. It will also show on a fence that has darkened with mildew. However, on normal weathered wood, it practically disappears. I buy it at Wal-Mart. If you have graffiti on your weathered wood fence, this is worth a try. You can always go back over it with a brushed-on rectangle if you are not satisfied with the appearance, but I have found I get better results this way.


