WRIGLEY **GOES TO POT?**

Medical Marijuana **Dispensary Ordinance**

Editor's Note: There appear to be four dispensaries in Wrigley: Two on Willow near Magnolia Avenue, one on Pacific Avenue near Hill Street and one on Pacific Place near the 405 Freeway.



On August 4, 2009, the City Manager, City Attorney and City Prosecutor were asked to prepare an ordinance to regulate medical marijuana establishments. This was a very complex issue that required many hours of public meetings. The City Attorney re-

turned a DRAFT ordinance to the City Council on November 10 to provide strict regulation of certain collectives. The City Council made recommendations that the City Attorney should:

- Consider whether the permitting of collectives can be processed as either an application for a conditional use permit, or as an application for an administrative use permit, as administered by the Director of Financial Management;
- Prohibit permitting of marijuana collectives within 1,500 feet of any high school; and,
- Establish an appropriate citywide limit as to the number of marijuana collective permits that can exist in the City at anytime.

The processing of the permit as a CUP/AUP, would initiate a public notice process. Other provisions of the proposed ordinance go to protecting patient privacy and access to legally conforming establishments. While the City is developing these regulations, any illegal activity or public nuisance can be reported to your police department.


& Hill Street as we light the Trees for 2009.



SEARCHING FOR LOST PETS IN LONG BEACH JUST GOT A LOT EASIER AT PETHARBOR.COM

Every sixty minutes, information about lost and stray pets is updated at www.petharbor.com. Another tool for improving the number of Long Beach animals returned to owners, Pet Harbor updates impound information to the web every hour and links residents to thousands of kennels across the region with the click of the mouse. Each year over 11,500 animals are impounded at Animal Care Services.

"We are constantly looking for ways to connect residents with their animals," says Ronald R. Arias, Health and Human Services Department Head, "Pet Harbor updates information every hour so that people don't have to wait an entire day to find information about their pets." The website now links directly to the City's dispatch, kennel and licensing database and is one part of the strategy for making the City of Long Beach the safest large city in California for people and animals.
