Lady Bird Johnson was quoted as saying: "While the spirit of neighborliness was important on the frontier because neighbors were so few, it is even more important now because neighbors are so many."

Doing home health care, I have been to many neighborhoods throughout the city. Really, it doesn't matter where you live, there will always be some run down homes and disruptive individuals. I was in a \$300,000.00 development where there was a foreclosure trashed out and left idle. What is important is those around us, not the location or price range. Every year, when we have National Night Out, we get to visit, meet and get reacquainted. However, it doesn't have to take a party to connect with your neighbors.

- 1. Wave even though you may not know someone.
- 2. Stop and compliment a neighbor on their yard, decorations or the dog they are walking.
- 3. Swap plants and landscaping supplies.
- 4. Share you extra garden produce.
- 5. If you know a person (s) who are alone or elderly, bring them some dessert or leftovers.
- 6. Volunteer to watch someone's house when they are at work or away. Ask them to do the same for you. Pick up their mail or newspaper.
- 7. Check on someone who is sick or who may need help.
- Call 911 to report suspicious activity or your neighborhood police officer. Discuss concerns. Don't be afraid to call 311 to report code violations such as overgrown lawns, trash, sound violations, broken fences, abandoned houses and cars.
- 9. We have a lot of military who live here. Volunteer to help a spouse who is by themselves while their partner is deployed or overseas.

What are the benefits of all this? One neighbor was on vacation and another neighbor saw a strange person looking at the house to rob. The police were called and a robbery was averted. Another person had her dogs escape and her neighbors rounded up the two escapees. Another neighbor had a heart attack and was checked on when she returned home. Trading succulents with one another, both neighbors have beautiful gardens. So take the time. Stop and talk to one another. Establish a face, name and address. We are not islands. That's what makes neighborhoods strong. That's what makes El Dorado great.



Do you know the difference between Cold and Flu?

<u>Fever</u>

Fever is rare with a cold.

Fever is usually present with the flu in up to 80% of all flu cases. A temperature of 100°F or higher for 3 to 4 days is associated with the flu. Coughing

A hacking, productive (mucus-producing) cough is often present with a cold.

A non-productive (non-mucus-producing) cough is usually present with the flu (sometimes referred to as dry cough).

Aches

Slight body aches and pains can be part of a cold.

Severe aches and pains are common with the flu. <u>Stuffy Nose</u>

Stuffy nose is commonly present with a cold and typically resolves spontaneously within a week.

Stuffy nose is not commonly present with the flu. Chills

Chills are uncommon with a cold.

60% of people who have the flu experience chills.

Tiredness

Tiredness is fairly mild with a cold.

Tiredness is moderate to severe with the flu.

Sneezing

Sneezing is commonly present with a cold.

Sneezing is not common with the flu.

Sudden Symptoms

Cold symptoms tend to develop over a few days. The flu has a rapid onset within 3-6 hours. The flu hits hard and includes sudden symptoms like high fever, aches and pains.

Headache

A headache is fairly uncommon with a cold.

A headache is very common with the flu, present in 80% of cases.

Sore Throat

Sore throat is commonly present with a cold.

Sore throat is not commonly present with the flu.

Chest Discomfort

Chest discomfort is mild to moderate with a cold. Chest discomfort is often severe with the flu.

Healthy Snow Pea Soup

(Great for diabetics and those watching their diets)

Ingredients:

3/4 cup sliced green onions

1/2 cup chopped onion

1 T margarine (liquid or tub)

1 lb. snow peas

2 cups coarsely chopped romaine lettuce

2 cups coarsely chopped spinach

4 cups low sodium vegetable broth

1/2 t dried tarragon

1 T dried mint

6 T plain fat free yogurt

Directions:

Sauté onions in margarine in large saucepan until tender. Add snow peas, lettuce and spinach. Sauté 5-10 minutes. Add broth, tarragon and mint. Bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer covered for 15 minutes or until snow peas are tender. Process soup in blender until smooth. Strain through a fine sieve. Serve warm or cold with yogurt garnish.




