

Have you taken the time to drive the streets in our neighborhood lately? Did you know Westridge is beginning to look "run down."

Protect your home investment and that of your neighbor. Be proud of where you live. Put trash cans behind your fence except on your trash pick-up day. Keep junk, wood piles, etc. behind your fence out of view. No parking boats, R.V.'s, campers, cars, trailers or trucks in your front yard. Remember Jefferson County code – boats, campers, trailers, R.V.'s can only be parked on streets a total of 14 days a year. That means each time you park, it counts as 24 hours or a full day.

Protect your investment and help make Westridge an outstanding place to live. We also need to address the "sagging fence" and leaning brick pillars on Westridge property where it runs along Simms Street. It is a negative reflection on Westridge and on our property values.

the habit of doing so. We do understand the urge to just leave it and walk away, but we need to get over the embarrassment, pick up the pooh and be responsible for your pet's mess. When you grab your dog's leash, grab a plastic bag too. If you forget, there are 4 holders that are usually filled with plastic bags for the sole purpose of dog owner's use and 3 trash cans to drop the filled bags into. Several neighbors save old bags and try to keep the holders full for your convenience. (A big THANK YOU to all those who donate to this cause). I have seen dog piles less than 5 feet from bag holders full of bags.

This summer when I was walking at Blue Heron Park on the path that stretches across the dam, I counted over 38 piles of dog pooh in that small stretch. On September 25th, Animal Control was called and agreed to patrol the park to make sure dog owners are picking up after their pets.

Let's work together to make our park cleaner, safer and a pleasant place for everyone to visit.

It's the Most Overwhelming Time of the Year

Although the holiday season comes ringing in with messages of joy, togetherness, love and fulfillment, it can be less than joyous for many people. Stress, depression, relationship problems or financial crises can overwhelm until they seem insurmountable. Unfortunately, the stigma associated with asking for help can sometimes seem just as scary.

We at the Sheriff's Office are not mental health experts. But as emergency responders and victim advocates, we bear witness to many of the tragic effects of emotional turmoil – including domestic violence and suicide. We see the pain and suffering these events inflict on families from all walks of life.

If you or someone you know needs emotional or financial help, there are many local organizations dedicated to providing these services at holiday time, or anytime. Here are just a few:

The Jefferson Center for Mental Health provides quality mental health services for those with emotional problems and/or serious mental illness. Individual and family counseling is available for anyone and everyone, with flexible payment structures starting at only \$5. Also, in response to heightened demand for services, a new program called Jefferson Center Partners was developed to give quick access to counseling for those coping with job loss, foreclosure or other problems related to the economy. www.jeffersonmentalhealth.org

Jefferson County Human Services provides emergency assistance with food, utilities, transportation and other basic needs. It manages protective services for children and at-risk adults to ensure the safety and well-being of all families.

range of services to residents of Jeffco's mountain communities. It offers everything from health clinics, counseling, domestic violence assistance and youth services to parenting classes, job search help and financial advice. **www.mrcco.org**

Family Tree offers a 24-hour crisis hotline for victims of domestic violence (**303-420-6752**), a shelter, and a free legal clinic to help victims understand their options. Family Tree also offers counseling and other free programs for families who have experienced domestic violence, child abuse, separation, divorce and other conflict in the home. **www.thefamilytree.org**

AMEND is a nonprofit organization working to end domestic violence by providing counseling to men who have been abusive, as well as advocacy and support to their partners and children. **www.amendinc.org**

FOR TEENS

According to the Jefferson Center for Mental Health, suicide is the third leading cause of death for youth ages 15-24. Intimate relationship conflicts or losses, disciplinary problems and other stressful life events often precede youth suicide.

The Second Wind Fund was launched after four Green Mountain High School students committed suicide during the 2001-2002 school year. The nonprofit works to ensure at-risk youth have access to mental health services quickly and efficiently by removing financial and social barriers to treatment. www.thesecondwindfund.org

The statewide Safe2Tell program offers students a toll-free number to call to anonymously report anything that threatens them, their friends, their school or their community. They can report suicide threats, harassment, gun possession, dating violence, stalking, or any other issue that raises red flags. Local law enforcement agencies follow up on the reports. **www.safe2tell.org**




