But remember, as our story above clearly displays, some criminals are brazen enough to walk up and around your house looking in windows, etc. Close your blinds or curtains if you can see a flat screen TV through them even


in the daytime or when you are not home.


So, please pay attention to your garage door and close it when you leave.
