- **Improves the community** Kids have the opportunity to be resources and contributors to their communities.
- Encourages a lifelong service ethic Kids who volunteer early learn the importance of service and have a higher chance of continuing to volunteer later in life.

Don't Forget Old Savings Bonds

Are you losing money by neglecting to redeem fully matured U.S. savings bonds? According to the Treasury Department's Bureau of the Public Debt, \$16 billion worth of bonds have not been cashed in, even though they no longer earn interest. Think there's one waiting for you? To check the status of Series E bonds bought from 1974 onward, plug the serial number into Treasury's Savings Bond Calculator (www.treasurydirect.gov/BC/SBC Price). To find a serial number, check the site's Treasury Hunt tool. For pre-1974 bonds, write the Bureau of Public Debt., P.O. Box 7012, Parkersburg, WV 26106-7012. Include details such as the bondholder's name or names and address at the time of purchase, and the approximate issue date and denomination. Bonds owned by the deceased can still be cashed in by their heirs.



Columbine Residents Doing Good

Last summer, there was a buzz in the air and it was not the bees; it was the **Bruso Family**, starting a movement to insure the safety of a recently developed area within Foothills P&RD. Word was coming out that the Clement Skatepark was in danger of having major change happen to it. The skate area had suffered graffiti tags, trash tossed around and gaining a reputation as an "eye sore." Ideas about fencing the area, charging admission, or worse, closure, sparked a grassroots efforts to help save the beloved hangout.

The Brusos are 20 year residents of Columbine Hills. Jean and Robert have 2 children; Nick, a Junior at Columbine High and his younger sister Danielle, a Freshman at Columbine High. The entire family is very active in the community. In September, Bob was awarded the "Citizenship Award" from the Jefferson County Sheriff's Dept., for his efforts in masterminding and pulling together "The Clement Skatepark Clean-up Day" and skate competition. Jean and Robert Bruso are also neighborhood business owners, who have owned and operated Robert's Italian Restaurant, located at 6745 West Ken Caryl Ave. at Pierce St, for 10 years. The Bruso's moved to Colorado from New York State, where Bob has been in the restaurant business since he was 13 years old. He started out under the teaching of a pizza parlor owner and found his love for the food business. Seeing an opportunity to start their own restaurant right in their neighborhood and cater to the community was a dream come true. Being able to sustain a thriving business in a small strip mall is quite the accomplishment. Now they are taking the opportunity to expand their restaurant into the space next door, doubling the seating capacity (110 max.), in the dining room, all new counters, seats, tables, booths and an expanded menu. There is also a beautiful full service bar and cocktail area, with big screen TVs. The Grand Re-Opening coincides with their 10 Year Anniversary celebration this year. What is the Future of Ken Caryl Middle School

When 3A & 3B were unsuccessful in passing during the last election, much thought and consideration has been processed at the District level about future school closures and budget cuts. Does it seem now, that Ken Caryl Middle School is being singled out? Some parent groups believe so. Flyers were distributed by the "Save the Columbine Community" group, outlining some very thought provoking conversation. A community meeting was held at the school on December 1st, with School Board Rep. Paula Noonan listening to the community. Will the school remain open? Will Columbine High School lose its ONLY feeder Middle School? How will students get to Deer Creek Middle School and across Wadsworth Blvd. safely? Will area students need to be bussed over to Deer Creek Middle School? Is that a savings for the District? What will happen to safety and security with a student population close to 1,100? Will any of this make as huge a difference for the school budget, as it will impact the community? Will our home values suffer from the school closure? What will happen to the Ken Caryl M.S. building? Does the District already have a buyer for the building? Will taxpayers be outraged at the "fire sale" price tag? Will neighborhood comments even make a difference? If you want to voice your opinion, contact Jeffco Schools. E-mail: facilities@jeffco.k12.co.us. Discussions will continue and some decisions are due to be announced after the Winter Break in January 2010.

Questions, questions!

"Why can't the snowplow driver change the angle of the blade to avoid plowing snow into driveways?"

The momentum needed to move the snow necessitates maintaining speed, sometimes up to 35 mph. Combined with the response time needed to change the angle of the blade, it's just not feasible to do that. "How did Coal Mine Avenue in Jefferson County get it's name? Was there at one time a coal mine in the area?"

There were a few coal mines in the area, with several larger ones in the Golden area. The Unity Mine, which later became the Economy Mine, was located near what is now Coal Mine Avenue and South Kipling St. and was active from 1932 until 1940. Another mine, farther south along Kipling St. was called the Christianson Mine from 1922 until 1932 and then the Littleton Mine from 1933 to 1939. These mines produced an adequate source of decent-quality coal in the 1930s and early 1940s. The Unity employed nine miners in 1935, while the Christianson Mine had 20 miners working there in 1930. Jefferson County adopted a geo-hazard zone in the 1970s that included much of the coal mine subsidence areas. In those areas, the county allows certain uses, such as parking lots, parks and open space, but will not allow single-family homes.
