## Winter and my Vehicle

The biggest cold weather starting problem is the battery.

Things to check in the fall:

Battery post. Make sure the post are clean and the clamps are tight on the post.

Clean battery case. Do this while the battery cables are removed for cleaning using a mixture of baking soda and water.

The age of the battery is important. Have a "Load Test" preformed to determine battery condition. After a couple years of service a battery will accumulate sediment at the bottom of the battery shorting out the plates causing failure. If the test fails, trouble will follow.

If you have an old battery, you can bet it will fail in cold weather.

If you are not mechanically inclined, take the vehicle to a respectable service center. Cheaper is not always the best.

### Got gas?

The gas tank can cause failure to start. Water and sediment are the big problems.

Water in the tank is due to moisture in the air. If you run your vehicle on the empty side of the fuel gauge you are looking for trouble. Running on an empty tank has a large air space between the fuel level and the tank. As air cools, moisture can form inside the tank. Over time, this can cause rough running or gas line freeze. Adding an additive such as "Dry Gas" can help prevent this problem. The best way to prevent this is to keep your gas tank on the full side.

If your vehicle seems a little sluggish check or replace the fuel line filter. The filter is usually located behind the carburetor or on the inside of the frame near the driver's door. (but not always) This is a forgotten item by most people.

### Tires tired?

One should check the tire pressure at least twice a year; spring and fall. If you notice one tire not looking like the others it could be low air pressure.

Proper air pressure will increase your gas mileage and longer tire life.

Safer driving. The vehicle will not handle right with uneven tire pressure, especially when cornering.

Tires wear faster if the shocks are bad since the tires bounce up and down flexing the side walls.

Don't forget the spare. Vehicles using a real spare tire needs air pressure check at the same time you check the other tires.

Every owner or occupant of any house or other building, and the owner or proprietor, lessee or persons entitled to possession of any vacant lot, and every person having charge of any church, jail, public hall or other public building in the city, shall, during the winter season and during the time snow shall continue on the ground, by 9:00 a.m. every day clean the sidewalk in front of such house or building, and in front of which lot, from snow or ice, and keep it conveniently free thereof during the day.

He shall also, at all times, keep such sidewalk clear from all dirt or filth, or other obstruction or encumbrance, so as to allow citizens to use the sidewalk in an easy and commodious manner. City Code: 99.047

### A 2010 Census Taker WARNING

How do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? The BBB offers the following advice:

- If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should NEVER invite anyone you don't know into your home.
- Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. DO NOT give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census. Census workers will not ask for banking and financial information nor will they solicit donations.
- Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail or in person at home. However, they will not contact you by e-mail, so be on the lookout for e-mail scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an e-mail that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

1) Any time you see an E-Mail that says forward this on to '10' (or however many) of your friends, sign this petition, or you'll get bad luck, good luck, you'll see something funny on your screen after you send it, or whatever, it almost always has an E-Mail tracker program attached that tracks the cookies and E-Mails of those folks you forward to.

All it was, and all any of this type of E-Mail is, is a way to get names and 'cookie' tracking information for telemarketers and spammers - - to validate active E-Mail accounts for their own profitable purposes.


You may think you are supporting a GREAT cause, but you are NOT!


Instead, you will be getting tons of junk mail later and very possibly a virus attached! Plus, we are helping the spammers get rich! Let's not make it easy for them!


