EXCERPTS FROM YOUR DEED/ COVENANT RESTRICTIONS:

No fence, wall, or hedge shall be built or maintained forward of the front wall line of the respective house, not including decorative walls or fences which are part of the architectural design of the house, and which are not to be built or maintained nearer than 20' to the front property line of any lot. An exception shall be made in the case of retaining walls of not over twelve inches above the ground.

No fence, wall, or hedge shall be built or maintained which exceeds a height of seven feet.

Valentine's Day History

You'd think Valentine's Day trivia would start with the identity of the original Valentine. But nobody can say authoritatively who that was. One popular theory holds that Valentine was a Roman clergyman executed for performing secret marriages in defiance of Emperor Claudius II, who thought marriage weakened his soldiers.

Pope Gelasius I declared Feb. 14 as Valentine Day in A.D. 496. Over time, the Christian holiday became associated with romance and exchanging love messages. St. Valentine became the patron saint of lovers.

The modern history of Valentine's Day includes Esther Howland, a native of Massachusetts in the 1840s, who is credited with selling the first mass-produced valentine cards.

About Groundhog Day (February 2, 2010)



Here are some answers to Frequently Asked Questions about the holiday:

- Yes! Punxsutawney Phil is the only true weather forecasting groundhog. The others are just impostors.
- How often is Phil's prediction correct? 100% of the time, of course!
- How many "Phils" have there been over the years? There has only been one Punxsutawney Phil. He has been making predictions for over 120 years!
- Punxsutawney Phil gets his longevity from drinking the "elixir of life," a secret recipe. Phil takes one sip every summer at the Groundhog Picnic and it magically gives him seven more years of life.
- On February 2, Phil comes out of his burrow on Gobbler's Knob - in front of thousands of followers from all over the world - to predict the weather for the rest of winter.
- According to legend, if Punxsutawney Phil sees his shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter weather. If he does not see his shadow, there will be an early spring.
- No! Phil's forecasts are not made in advance by the Inner Circle. After Phil emerges from his burrow on February 2, he speaks to the Groundhog Club president in "Groundhogese" (a language only understood by the current president of the Inner Circle). His proclamation is then translated for the world.
- ◆ The celebration of Groundhog Day began with Pennsylvania's earliest settlers. They brought with them the legend of Candlemas Day, which states, "For as the sun shines on Candlemas Day, so far will the snow swirl in May..."
- Punxsutawney held its first Groundhog Day in the 1800s. The first official trek to Gobbler's Knob was made on February 2, 1887.
- So the story goes, Punxsutawney Phil was named after King Phillip. Prior to being called Phil, he was called Br'er Groundhog.

Presidents Day Trivia

The third Monday in February is designated in the United States as Washington's Birthday, more commonly known as Presidents Day. This list looks at facts and traditions surrounding the celebration of this holiday.

1. Not Officially Presidents Day

As stated in the introduction, the federal holiday celebrated on the third Monday in February is not officially called Presidents Day. Instead, it is Washington's Birthday. There was an attempt in 1968 to officially name it Presidents Day. However, this suggestion died in committee. Many states, however, choose to call their own celebration on this day "Presidents Day."

2. Washington's Birthday Celebrated During Washington's Lifetime

Many across the newly formed United States celebrated Washington's Birthday in the 17th century while George Washington was still alive. However, it wasn't until 1885 that Chester Arthur signed the bill that made it a federal holiday.

3. Abraham Lincoln's Birthday is Not a Federal Holiday

Even though many states celebrate Abraham Lincoln's birthday concurrently with Washington's birthday, it is not a federally designated holiday.

4. Cherries, Cherries, and More Cherries

Traditionally, many celebrated and continue to celebrate Washington's Birthday with desserts made with cherries. Cherry pie, cherry cake, bread made with cherries, or just a huge bowl of cherries are often enjoyed on this day. Of course, this relates to the apocryphal story that Washington would not tell a lie when asked if he cut down a cherry tree.

5. Shopping and Sales

One thing that many people connect with Presidents Day is retail sales. In the 1980s, retailers began to use this holiday as a time to clear out their old stock in preparation for spring and summer. One wonders what George Washington would have thought about this celebration of his birthday.

6. Reading of Washington's Farewell Address

On February 22nd of almost every year since 1888, Washington's Farewell Address has been read in the US Senate. While this does not happen on Presidents Day, it is an annual celebration of Washington's Birthday that stems from 1862 when the Address was read as a way to boost morale during the Civil War. This address was and is so important because it warns of political factionalism, geographical sectionalism, and interference by foreign powers in the nation's affairs. Washington stressed the importance of national unity over sectional differences.

Did You Know?

- ◆ Store your open chunks of cheese in aluminum foil. It will stay fresh much longer and not mold.
- ◆ Reduce static cling: Pin a small safety pin to the seam of your slip and you will not have a clingy skirt or dress. Same thing works with slacks that cling wearing panty hose. Place pin in seam of slacks and static is gone.
- ◆ To get rid of a foggy windshield, buy a chalkboard eraser and keep it in the glove compartment. When the window is foggy, rub with eraser. Works better than a cloth.

From Why and When to call SAPD

- Any vehicles moving slowly without lights, or following a course that appears aimless or repetitive is suspicious in any location. Occupants may be "casing" for places to rob or burglarize, or could be drug pushers or sex offenders.
- ◆ Parked, occupied vehicles containing one or more personas are especially significant if observed at an unusual hour. They could be lookouts for crime in progress.
- ◆ Vehicles being loaded with valuables are suspicious if parked in closed businesses or untended residences, even if the vehicle is a legitimate looking commercial unit.

The Worker, Homeownership, and Business Assistance Act of 2009, extends and expands the First-Time Homebuyer's Tax Credit. Under this new law an eligible taxpayer must buy, or enter into a contract to buy, a principal residence on or before April 30, 2010 and close on the home by June 30, 2010. Taxpayers with qualifying purchases in 2010 can opt for a tax credit on their 2009 or 2010 tax return. The law also authorizes the credit for long-time homeowners buying a replacement of their principal residence AND Raises the income limitations for homeowners claiming the credit.






