The 2010 Fircrest Chipper Day has been scheduled for April 17. Watch here for more info coming soon. The Clean-Up Day is scheduled for May 29th and we'll be calling for truck driving volunteers to come help us with pickups. New this year will be a release form that residents will be required to sign before any items can be picked up. This service is for senior citizens and residents with disabilities. Absolutely no items will be picked up without a resident present at the home. No exceptions will be made. Sorry we cannot be as flexible on this as we have been in the past.

New e-waste guidelines to keep in mind as you collect debris for the day: We will not be able to accept computers, TVs, monitors or laptops as garbage. Oregon passed legislation prohibiting disposal of these items in a landfill, and since our trash goes to a landfill in Oregon, we must comply with the rules. These four items can be recycled for free through the state-wide E-cycle Washington program. Goodwill Stores are one of the places that these electronics can be taken for recycling through the state program.
