Flu refers to illnesses caused by a number of different influenza viruses. Flu can cause a range of symptoms and effects, from mild to lethal. Two strains of flu are currently circulating in the United States: 1) seasonal flu and 2) pandemic H1N1 flu. This pandemic H1N1 flu is made up of bird (avian), swine and human flu viruses, that is why we are no longer calling it just "swine" flu.

Health officials expect that more cases, hospitalizations and deaths from this pandemic will occur during the 2009-2010 flu season. SomaliCAN is collaborating with Columbus Public Health, Franklin County, Ohio Department of Health, Office of the Governor, CareSource, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the US Department of Health and Human Services to educate the Somali community about H1N1 and seasonal influenza.

Prevent Getting and Spreading the Flu

- Get a seasonal flu shot – available now
- Stay home from work or school if you are sick
- Cover your cough with your arm or tissue
- Wash your hands often and use alcohol-based hand sanitizer (60% alcohol)
- Don't touch your eyes, nose or mouth
- Avoid close contact with sick people
- Get the H1N1 vaccine when available

Symptoms of H1N1

The symptoms of H1N1 flu are similar to seasonal flu, but may be more severe. These can include: cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills, fatigue, and vomiting or diarrhea for some.

Anyone with flu-like symptoms should stay home at least 24 hours after being fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medications.

Pregnant women are at greater risk for getting very sick with the flu. If you are pregnant and become sick, contact your doctor right away.

H1N1 Flu Vaccine:

No shortage of H1N1 vaccine is expected. At first, the vaccine supply will be limited, so it is being given first to people who are at highest risk for severe illness. Clinic sites will be listed at www.ColumbusPandemicFlu.org.

April 1, 2010 is Census Day in the United States. That is the official day of the full and complete count of the resident population (legal and illegal) of the United States. The decennial (every ten years) U.S. Census is an activity that is mandated in the U.S. Constitution.

Article I, Section II states:

The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years, in such Manner as they shall by Law direct.

On the short 2010 Census form, the questions will include: name, age, sex, date of birth, race, ethnicity, relationship (to the first name listed on the form), and housing tenure (whether a family owns or rents their home). Individuals and families will fill out the form based on accurate information for their household as of April 1, 2010.

From April through July 2010, census takers will visit homes that did not return the form to the Census Bureau. Federal law requires every household to comply with census requirements by filling out a form or responding to a census taker's questions.

The data collected by the Census Bureau is completely confidential. It is important to get counted in the 2010 Census to ensure fair representation for Ohio residents, as well as federal funding for vital public services in our state and communities. Dawn Butler.

April 1, 2010 waa maalinta tirakoobka ee Maraykanka. Waa maalinta rasmiga ah ee la tiriyo dadka deggan (sharci iyo sharci la'aanba) Maraykanka. Tobnaalaha (toban sanoo kasta) U.S. Census waa hawl uu sharciyeeyey qaanuunka Maraykanka. Qodobka I, Qaybta II ayaa tibiaaxaya:

Tirin dhab ah ayaa saddex sano gudahood oo kalfadhiga koongareeska Maraykanka ugu horreeya la qaban doonaa, toban-toban sano ayaana xigi doonta, sidaa ayayna arrintu sharci ku tahay. Foomka gaaban ee 2010 Census su'aalihisa waxaa ka mid ah: magac, da', jinsi, taariikh dhalasho, sinji, qolo, xigaalnimo (qofka ugu horreeya ee foomka ku qoran), iyo habka hoy deggenaanta (inuu qoysku leeyahay guriga iyo in kale). Shakhshiyaadka iyo qoysaska ayaa buuxin doona foomka iyagoo ku salaynaya xogta dhabta ah ee qoyskooda lagu keeno April 1, 2010.

Min April ilaa July 2010, tirokoobayaasha waxay booqan doonaan guryaha aanan foomkii u celinin Hoggaanka Tirakoobka. Sharciga federaalka ahaa faraya in qoys waliba uu la shaqeeyo hannaanka oo ama uu foomka diro ama uu su'aalaha uga jawaabo tirakoobayaasha.

Xogta uu aruuriyo Hoggaanka Tirakoobka waa mid sir ahaan xafidan. Franklin County Government Somali Work Group: Mark Anthony

The second meeting of the subcommittee, hosted by Somali Community Association of Ohio (SCAO), 3422 Cleveland Ave. in Columbus, was well attended by the Somali public, although there was a drop-off in participation by subcommittee members. Michael R. Pannell, Director of Franklin County Emergency Management and Homeland Security (FCEM&HS), led a presentation about emergency preparedness that concluded with questions from the audience of approximately 50 Somali residents. Interpreter services were provided by Jibril Hirsi and Adam O'Hirsi, both of Somali Community Access Network. Pannell presented a weather alert radio and Somali-language emergency preparedness wall posters and fliers to the SCAO. Weather alert radios broadcast round-the-clock weather reports from the National Weather Service and alerts listeners if there is a dangerous storm or other emergency threatening the area. The agency plans to make similar presentations to other Somali community centers in Franklin County.

Reactions to President Sharif's Visit to the State of Ohio: Mary Wright

President of Somalia, Sharif Sheikh Ahmed spent three days (October 6-8) in Columbus, Ohio. The president met with members of the Somali community in Ohio and repeatedly appealed for their support. He also heard the concerns and suggestions of various Somali community leaders. The President characterized his visit to the United States as "fruitful."

The President hailed the Somali community as "industrious and hardworking citizens who make positive contributions to their host communities". His message was to prevent Somali youth in the US from joining opposition groups in Somalia and to encourage them to focus on improving their educational standards and their professional skills.

Stephanie Harrison, a Columbus resident, went to see President Ahmed, the leader of Somalia's Transitional Federal Government, speak on Wednesday (October 7th). She later, quizzed some Somalis about his visit.

Madaxweynaha Soomaaliya, Shariif Sheekh Axmed ayaa saddex beri (October 6-8) joogey Columbus, Ohio. Madaxweynuhu wuxuu la kulmay xubnaha bulshada Soomaaliyeed ee Ohio aadna wuxuu ugu celceliyey codsiga taageeradooda. Sidoo kale wuxuu dhegaystay walaacyada iyo talooyinka hoggaamiyayaasha kala duwan ee Soomaalida ah. Madaxweynaha aya safarkiisii Maraykanka ku sheegay mid ah "mirodhal."

Madaxweynaha ayaa umadda Soomaaliyeed ku sheegay inay yihiin "kuwo waxsoo-saar badan aadna u shaqeeya oo wax fiican ku soo kordhiyey bulshooyinkii ay martiyeen". Farrintiisu waxay ahayd in laga sajiyo dhallinta Soomaalida ah ee reer Maraykan in ay ku biiraan kooxaha mucaaradka ah ee gudaha ka diraya iyo in lagu tirtirsiyo in ay ku foognaadaan horumarinta heerkooda aqooneed iyo xirfadahooda hawleed.
