swer any questions other than who lives at the address. DO NOT GIVE ANYONE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION SUCH AS Social Security number, credit card or banking information.

While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, YOU DON'T HAVE TO ANSWER ANYTHING AT ALL ABOUT YOUR FINANCIAL SITUATION. Any one asking for that information is NOT with the Census Bureau. BE CAUTIOUS, BUT BE COUNTED



February is "National Prevent a Litter Month"

Every spring, cats and dogs that have not been spayed or neutered give birth to countless puppies and kittens – overwhelming shelters all over the country with unwanted litters. As a result, there are always far more dogs and cats than there are homes. Each year in this country more than 5,000,000 unwanted animals are euthanized.



Altering Animals and Attitudes

To reach the goal of a measurable, sustainable reduction in animal shelter deaths, Clinico offers affordable, high quality spay/neuter services. While traditional veterinary clinics charge between \$100 and \$400 to spay or neuter an animal, depending on size and gender, Clinico charges between \$65 and \$160 with substantial discounts offered to **pet owners with income below** \$40,000. Please call the clinic for information on how to qualify for the discounted prices. The City of Long Beach also has vouchers that further reduces the cost to as little as \$5.

It is also one of the few clinics that will provide services to people-shy stray cats. There are many people in **Wrigley** willing to look after these abandoned animals, but can't always afford the initial costs for shots, which Clinico also offers, and spay/neuter services.

Animals as young as 8 weeks or as small as 2 pounds are accepted. In addition, Clinico plans to provide pet transport for the reported 30% of the population that do not own a car.

Bring them in as well, dogs are not capable of fighting off these wild predators...



La Casa Rancho Los Cerritos Historic Site is a public museum today, but was built in 1844 as the adobe home and grounds for Spanish, Mexican and American families who helped transform Southern California from its ranching beginnings to a modern, urban society.

The ranch includes a two-story Monterey-style adobe dating to the 1860s. A tour of the adobe home is specially geared toward youth groups. Program includes a fun and educational tour of the 1844 adobe house and hands-on activities.

"The U.S.-Mexico War in Southern California" (1846-48) will be the topic of a presentation by Steve Clugston, living history presenter, event organizer and former curator at March Field Air Museum, on February 20.


