The association will be furnishing the hamburgers, hotdogs, soda and paper products. This will be a potluck lunch if you feel like bringing a dish to share with our neighbors.



Clearwater Police Department/Crime Watch

CPD is exited to announce the availability of a new program entitled *Calls for Service Data*. This program will give you direct access, via the web, to information about criminal activity in our neighborhood.

The data generated under this program represents many of the calls for police service. The call type is as received in the dispatch center. The final outcome of the investigation may be titled differently. The call types include Armed Robbery, Assaults, Battery, Burglary, Carjacking, Criminal Mischief, Drug calls, Homicide, Lewd and Lascivious (address withheld(, Prostitution, Prowler, Robbery, Sexual Battery (address withheld), Shooting, Suspicious Event, Suspicious Person, Suspicious Vehicle, Theft, and Weapons Violations.

Below are basic instructions on how to access the program and how to retrieve information.

Calls for Service Data Retrieval Instructions

- 1. Go to the Police Website at http://www.clearwaterpolice.org/
- 2. In the left window, find and click on the Calls for Service Data
- 3. When site comes up, you must first read an informational screen...then click okay. The map screen will come up.
- 4. On the far left is a slide bar that will let you zoom in on the map. Zoom in until you can read some streets.
- 5. Use your mouse curser to move the map around until you find the grid for the area you are interested in. Note the grid number(s). You may choose up to 4 at a time.
- 6. In the window at the left choose the year and month of interest. Then check the grid(s) that you are interest in. (Woodgate is in Grid #: 232A, District #3)
- 7. Next click the Create a Report button and the Calls for Service report will pop up.

If you want to save this information, click the Export to Excel button towards the top of that screen and follow your normal saving documents procedures.

Note: This program has other ways to accomplish the same data retrieval and other functions that you are free to explore.

In addition to the Neighborhood Watch Program, Clearwater also has a crime watch program. The City Crime Watch program is an email-based program where members will receive regular email bulletins with information about crime, police activity and crime prevention.
