Take Advantage of "One Call To City Hall" Dial 3-1-1 for Non-Emergency Services

When you need to contact the City of Fort Wayne for a non-emergency issue such as a street light repair or to report a missed garbage collection, there's no need to search for the right phone number. Just remember 3-1-1.

3-1-1 is a City-wide toll free number for information and non-emergency services. Calls to the One Call to City Hall center are answered Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM until 5:30 PM. The call center is staffed by agents who are trained to provide information or refer calls to the appropriate City department for action. Calls are referred to the right department the first time so that callers are assured of receiving service in a timely manner.

The 3-1-1 call takers have access to a custom designed information data base that helps them to provide correct information and accurate referrals to City departments. As a citizen you can use the 3-1-1 service to:

- Report concerns such as: abandoned cars, missed garbage pickup, water main breaks or rusty water, street lights that have burned out, drainage issues
- Request services such as: street or sewer maintenance, street cleaning, pothole repair
- Request information on: recycling or other City services, public meeting schedules, City-wide events
- Receive general information about the City of Fort Wayne, its services and programs.

From within the City limits, residents can simply dial 3-1-1 from a wired or wireless phone to reach the One Call to City Hall service center. From outside the City limits, the service center can be reached by dialing 427-8311.

The One Call to City Hall service center is accessible by persons with speaking or hearing impairments.

You may also reach the service center by dialing 3-1-1 on your cellular phone if your cellular service is provided by Verizon Wireless, Sprint, T-Mobile, Vonage and US Cellular.

3-1-1 services can also be accessed by sending an email to <u>311@cityoffortwayne.org</u> and may also be accessed through the City's web site at www.cityoffortwayne.org.

For a police, fire or medical emergency, 9-1-1 is still the number to call.

The Fort Wayne Police Department - Mad Ants Safety Awareness Program, launched in the fall of 2009, was designed to not only teach children about safety but to give them a place to turn in case they find themselves in a dangerous situation. This goal is accomplished by rallying enough homes and businesses to saturate the Fort Wayne community with Safe Havens, creating a network large enough to ensure the safety of every child. The Safe Havens will be easily identified by a decal placed in the windows of the designated buildings and homes so that children know where to go if they need help.



Rain Garden Workshops

Fort Wayne City Utilities is continuing its efforts to have 1,000 residential rain gardens in the City. A rain garden is a landscaped area that

receives storm water runoff from a downspout or other source, holds the water for a short time and helps it soak into the ground rather than running off. Rain gardens are typically planted with native plants, many of which you may already have in your yard. Some examples are Purple Coneflower, Black-Eyed Susan and New England Asters. City residents can receive free plants or a cash incentive for rain garden construction, but to do so, your must attend one of the rain garden workshops.

There will be four workshops each month for March, April and May. Check dates and times by going to www.catchingrainfw.org or by calling Fort Wayne City Utilities at (260) 427-1381. An information card was also in the last City Utilities bill. The workshops are free, but registrations are requested.

What's the Difference Between a Watch and a Warning?

Tornado Watch

Conditions are favorable for severe weather, including a tornado. A tornado watch usually lasts 2-6 hours and covers a section of the state. Keep an eye on the sky for changes in the weather. A watch allows time to prepare.

- Listen to local radio and TV weather reports.
- Locate all members of your family and know where they will be.
- Review your tornado safety drill.
- *Make sure your first aid kit is complete.*
- If time permits, secure items that could be carried away or propelled such as garbage cans and lawn furniture. Park vehicles in a garage if possible

Tornado Warning

A tornado has been spotted. Time to act! *Take cover immediately.* Stay away from glass, outside walls, and things that could fall on you. A warning usually is issued for a portion of a county and lasts 30 minutes to an hour.
