

Style Tips for Bargain Decor

Fresh, funky, and super-cheap, these decorating ideas are wallet-friendly and style-savvy. You can be creative on a budget.

Take a Seat

Drive through any neighborhood on trash day and you're sure to find a beat-up chair or two. Rescue the sturdy ones with sandpaper, primer, and paint . Re-cover the seat by cutting fabric 3 inches larger all around and attaching it with a staple gun.

Bold Art

Scraps of decorative friezes, spindles, or even branches and leaves from nature, make a statement when set off by a frame. Insert colorful scrapbook paper in the frame as a background. Then use Mirror Mastic adhesive to apply the piece directly to the frame's glass. Fabric is another fun way to create art work. Fabric stores sell remnants very cheap. Take an assortment of your favorite fabric and showcase them in array of mismatched frames. Paint the frames with coordinating colors.

I may find a picture at a yard sale, the Dollar Store, or Ross. I may not like the picture, but love getting a fun frame.

Collect various plates from garage sales, and thrift stores. Select by similar colors, different patterns. Hang them on the wall as a group.

This three dimensional idea adds interest to any kitchen or dining room.

Hide Items in Style

Too much clutter for glass class cabinet doors? Hide the cabinet's contents by lining the glass panels with patterned fabric. On the back of each door, stretch the fabric over the glass and use a staple gun to fasten the edges to the wooden frame. For a tidy appearance inside, conceal the staples by gluing coordinating ribbon.

Jewelry Art

Turn a wood cutlery tray into a beautiful piece of art. Glue scrapbooking papers to the bottom of each compartment using an adhesive appropriate for paper and wood; secure screw eyes to the cubbies to hold jewelry. Select favorite pieces to fill the tray.

Jazz up paper lampshade shade by punching holes evenly around the bottom edge. Clip earrings through the holes.

Color Styled

Grocery store flowers and ones from your garden offer cheer for mere pennies, but don't just plop them in a vase. Sorting the blooms by color and separating them into small vessels make them much more. Be creative when it comes to what can be used as a vase. Use tea cups, drinking glasses, and old jars. I have egg cups that make perfect bud vases.

The 3rd Annual Wrigley River Run & Tadpole Trot will be held June 12th. The event starts and ends at the corner of Pacific and Willow. There will be a 10k Run at 7:30am followed by the 5k run at 8:30am, the 5k walk and jogging stroller 5k at 8:35am, and a kids run at 9:30am.





All registered participants will receive a high quality short sleeve race t-shirt as well as complementary Buono's pizza, Clif bar products and other food and drink at the finish line festival. The route goes through historic parts of Wrigley and along the LA River path. Live music from the Cabrillo High School Jazz Band and encouragement from the Wilson High School Cheerleading Team will keep participants motivated along the course.

There will be a bounce house for the kids as well as awards and prizes.

Unusual Sweet and Savory Toppings Featured at Farmers' Markets

Fresh, delicious hand-crafted seasonal jams, preserves, pickles, relishes, sauces and more created by the Wrigley Garden are now available at several locations. Made in small batches from local ingredients, products currently include strawberry jelly, lemon curd, orange-ginger marmalade, rosemary-lemon butter, honey wine jelly and strawberry rhubarb jam and will change with the seasons. Local baker Shortnin' Bread features the products at the Sunday Farmers' Market (California @ Bixby) and at the Marine Stadium Farmers' Market (Appian Way and Nieto Ave.) on Wednesday. Vendor Bee Canyon Ranch carries Wrigley Garden honey-based goods at the Santa Monica Farmers' Market.

"Every ingredient is organic and locally grown when possible," said Wrigley Garden Director Sasha Kanno. "This direct connection between farmer and consumer means Long Beach can easily enjoy the season's freshest local products." Sales help support the Wrigley Garden, a community garden at 1950/1960 Henderson Avenue.

Some of the raw material for these sweet and savory treats comes from the Neighborhood Co-op Fruit Exchange. Volunteers harvest excess fruit from Long Beach residents, share it among neighbors and friends, preserve and donate the rest to a local food bank.
