The Prince George's County Police Department's Robbery Unit is urging citizens to use caution after two related residential robberies in which the suspects posed as local utility workers in the Forestville and Suitland areas. The Prince George's County Police Department is offering the following safety tips:

- Keep your door locked when answering a knock
- Demand workers to show photo identification
- Call the person's place of business to verify their identity and reason for being at your home
- Call 911 to report any suspicious persons in your neighborhood
- Check your surroundings before entering or exiting your home or vehicle
- Never let anyone you do not know into your home
- Follow all the above guidelines for any solicitor at your door

Yard Waste Collection – As of January 1, 2010, weekly curbside collection has been offered year round for yard waste (grass, leaves, small branches)--on Wednesdays in our community. Branches and limbs must not exceed 4 feet in length and 3 inches in diameter and must be securely tied in bundles that weigh less than 60 pounds.
