April 7, 2010 Meeting Reports

Gordon Neuenfeldt, Jeffco Sheriff, presented the crime statistics. Commercial burglaries have occurred along the Bowles corridor. There have been several golf course break-ins throughout the metro area. They have cut lines and stolen from maintenance sheds. Spring Break was last month. There was an increase in vehicle crimes. Most vehicles were unlocked.

The Presentation was given by **Jason Pearson**, Metro Area Graffiti Task Force, and **Patrice Thomas**, **Tom Dittemore**, **Mike Venturini**, **and John Winn**, Foothills Parks and Recreation District candidates.

Jason Pearson is the Director of the Metro Area Graffiti Task Force. This is an all volunteer group. Their goal is the intervention and prevention of graffiti. They started with 4 people. Now they have 150 people. They have expanded to 5 states and are talking to Cozumel, Mexico. **Greg LaCerte** was one of the original members. Membership costs \$35/year. Anyone can join. They also accept tax deductible donations. Their website is **www.magtfdenver.org**. Their phone number is **303-335-0946**.

Graffiti is made up of tagging (you can't read it), throw ups (take more time to complete), pieces (usually in alleys), and productions (take up a whole wall). They identify the perpetrators by surveillance, web searches, and have just started using art geographic profiling. They are trying to solve the problem of communication with other agencies.

They use GRIP to get through all the data. GRIP is an acronym for Graffiti Reduction and Interception Program. It is a design database from an Australian company. It is GPS enabled, online 24/7, federally compliant and secure, international, and easy to use and navigate. They provide free access to citizens. The Sheriff's Department has to pay for it, but they get access to more information. It is cost effective. The website is **www.grip-systems.org**. You can upload pictures, descriptions, and addresses.

- Is doing graffiti a felony? It is if the damage is more than \$1,000. Also it is a federal offense when done on the outside of a train.
- What should I do if I see someone doing it? Be discreet! Call 911. Get a good description of the person so you can be a good witness.

• What are the consequences for a young person? It depends on the area. In Denver, the person is put in jail. In other areas the offense is based on factors such as decisions by the municipal court, whether or not restitution is made, etc.

The candidates for Foothills Parks and Recreation District (FPRD) wards that were able to attend were Tom Dittemore, Patrice Thomas, Mike Venturini, and John Winn. Judy Johnson was not able to attend, but emailed information to Justin. The election is on May 4. They each gave a brief summary.

Patrice Thomas is running for Ward 4. She has lived at Columbine West for 21 years. She thinks that FPRD is a community asset. It ties us together. They have good programs. She walks several trails. She has no agenda except to serve.

Tom Dittemore is running for Ward 4. He has lived here for 29 years. FPRD is a community. The wards will provide better representation for the community. He wants to represent Ward 4 and the whole district.

Mike Venturini is running for Ward 3. He has lived in the FRPD area for 13 years. He has 2 children. FPRD provides us a community. It is made up of world class facilities, parks, etc. at a great cost.

John Winn is running for Ward 3. He has lived in Morrison since 1978. He went to High School in Morrison. He was on the Belleview Acres HOA back in 1999 and supported creating the FPRD. He wants to focus on revenue, budget, and maintenance issues.

Judy Johnson is running for Ward 3. She is a Colorado native and has spent most of her life in the FPRD area. She thinks that FPRD has several fantastic facilities, parks, and golf courses. They have done an excellent job of balancing the budget, maintaining the assets, and keeping spending in compliance with revenue. She would like to see more youth and adult hockey programs. She thinks that the golf courses will need updating in the near future. She wants FPRD to work with HOAs and neighborhoods to increase awareness of issues. She wants to achieve this by working marketing and her own contact list. The most important issue is getting through the current recession. She has worked on many boards and non-profit organizations. She will work diligently to serve the Foothills community in a fiscally conservative way.

Ballots should be mailed around April 14. If you do not get one, call FPRD to request a ballot.

If 5 of the 6 ward members vote for something and you are against it, are you likely to stand on your own or go along with the group? John and Mike would stand on his own. Tom would stand on his own but also wants to be supportive of the group. Patrice wants to be informed.

Do you support a new mil levy? Mike would explore every other avenue first and consider a mil levy as a last ditch effort. He is not a fan of mil levies and thinks that they should have an end date. Tom said "the same". He wants to figure out ways to retire debt and increase revenue. He is not in favor of cutting any more services and thinks that increasing services should increase revenue. It seemed like no one supported the last mil levy attempt. Patrice said "the same". She thinks that the voters have spoken. She wants to look at assets and resources. She wants to increase communication. She wants to understand needed capital repairs and maintenance. John said that the mil levy made sense at the time based on Janet's explanation. It depends on the situation.

Someone stated that he had attended meetings and the previous board seemed to find something for everyone. The staff seemed to dream up new programs that the boards generally rubber stamped. Rates went up even though his social security did not. What are the areas where you want to focus and where you want to see improvements. Patrice wants to look into subsidizes. They can't make major changes on what is charged participants immediately, but it can change. Mike wants to break the budget out by division or program. He wants to run FPRD like a business. He thinks that each area needs to make money or break even. Tom agreed. He wants to look are each area. A program should be available until it is no longer wanted. John is a business person. He wants to analyze everything. If a program is not making money, why is it in place?

Four of the current board members want to put the mil levy back on the ballot. The 6th Ave area is large and wants to secede. Why is FPRD spending money to fight this? John said that laws need to be followed and so far they are not doing this. Mike said that it seems to be a small but vocal group which may not represent the whole area. There has not yet been a vote by the residents. He wants to look at the economics. They have not specified how FPRD will be compensated for the facilities and parks that would leave the district. Tom agreed. Patrice said that it is not a unanimous voice. It is coming mostly from Mesa View Estates. And it is not seceding, but exclusion. The board has been trying to negotiate. The lawsuit was brought by Mesa View Estates.

FPRD did not buy the parks; they were donated by the developer. There is still an imbalance on money spent versus less benefit.

Some complained about the distance to the facilities. The average participant is 12 to 14 miles from a facility. Tom said that after there is an exclusion, there will be a waterfall. John said that everything is relative with mileage.

Do you golf? Patrice said no, she swims and hikes. Tom said yes, but not well. Mike said yes. John said yes.

Do you have any last words? John said that he volunteers to help. He wants to give back. All the Ward 3 candidates (John, Mike and Judy) are good. Mike said he enjoys the facilities. He wants to be involved and a steward of the monies. He will take a business approach and agreed that all were good candidates. Tom agreed that all were good candidates. He enjoyed the opportunity to run and wants to represent the people in the community. He wants to do what needs to be done. Patrice agreed. FPRD is important to the community's life styles. She will be a listener first. She wants FPRD to be the best.

Mr. Biggs' liquor license was revoked at the hearing. 2 new people are applying for a new license so there will be a new hearing. One of the people is associated with Mr. Cormier. The other is from Oregon. They will own the property 50/50.

The Board of Adjustments upheld the zoning violation on the medical marijuana business near Coal Mine and Wadsworth. It looks like they will appeal. They are not closing yet.

There was a hearing on the assisted living residence at Bright and Bowles. They are proposing a 1 story nursing home and specialize in head and spinal injuries.

Kathy Hartman hopes that laws are passed in the marijuana issue. The state can't force businesses to close until there is a lawsuit.

HB 10-1278 is to create a State Omnibudsman Office where citizens can appeal HOA decisions. It passed the House and is going to the Senate. Tom Martino has been on a tirade about HOAs.

Kathy Hartman discussed the County Community Survey of Residents in unincorporated Jefferson County. 95% of the respondents liked the quality of life. This is up from 90% in 2004. Open Space was the item that was liked best. Safety also rated high. There was an open-ended question asking about our concerns. Some of them were budget, maintaining services, and growth. When asked if they would support a mil levy increase, the answer was no. Overall we have improved in most areas since the last survey in 2004. When asked to compare our community with others with 300K+ residents, they said we were better except with public transportation. One question asked if cuts have to be made, what 2 items should be kept. The answer was law and road services (snow and maintenance). What 2 items should be cut? The answer was roads, buildings and libraries. Kathy can give a presentation on this if we want.

The following roads are being worked on this summer: Chatfield, Quincy, Wadsworth and Bowles, and Kipling between Simms and Coal Mine. Please be safe.




