June Meeting Notes

During the June CECA meeting, there were 24 residents in attendance. Our guest speaker was David McPeter, who is the Lone Ranger



Handyman. He covered important points for getting projects around the house done, how to select a company to do the work and answered various questions.

New business that was discussed during the meeting included the idea of purchasing and using an automatic dialer to call members and remind them of upcoming meetings and events. After discussing the basics of how it would work, it was decided to revisit this topic during a future meeting.

Emmanuel Remy brought up the idea of putting permanent signs at all 7 entrances, letting people know they are entering Clinton Estates. Bids we have received so far, are in the \$3,000 - \$9,000 range, so it was decided that we would look into signs

provided by the city to see what they would cost and into simpler signs like those seen in Forest Park which attach to speed limit sign poles. Emmanuel will look into this further, and it will be discussed again.

We also discussed the robbery that occurred on Shady Lane recently and how suspects fled through our neighborhood and were able to hide in weeds and bushes. It was also discussed where they were ultimately apprehended and how it was handled by the police.

Another Rave Review for Geno's Restaurant

If you have a favorite local restaurant in Northland, this is the place to share your recommendation. I received no reviews for this newsletter, but I have heard good comments about Yanni's Greek restaurant on Cleveland Ave., south if I-270. Been there? Liked it? I did hear from our neighbor Billy Jo Altier, who says she just "cannot rave enough about Geno's!... the quality of Geno's Italian dishes are above any I have had from a Columbus restaurant in the 20 years I have lived here." Billy Jo comes from an Italian family and grew up on Sunday Italian dinners prepared by her maternal grandmother or paternal grandfather. She has tried almost every Italian restaurant in Columbus from the franchises to the smaller more independently owned Italian restaurants, and while some were very good, none were great. However, Billy Jo says flat out, "Geno's dinners are great!"

She reports that the pasta and sauce at Geno's resemble her great grandmother's homemade cooking. Billy Jo says she ordered Geno's pasta and chicken parrmesan to take to her grandmother's for Easter. She commented, "my out of town family was delighted. They were reminded of the days when her Great Grandmother was alive from the flavor of the sauce, to the quality of the homemade pasta, to the flavor of the homemade Italian salad dressing! The price, quality, portions, and variety of Italian dinners offered at Geno's are the best I have had in Columbus." She adds: "By the way, their pizza specials are great too!" Billy Jo sums it up by saying "Geno's is truly a family owned restaurant with traditional, fresh homemade Italian food! Geno's is my Italian restaurant of choice!"


New Newsletter Editor Needed
