

As a neighborhood partner, WANA's, May 8<sup>th</sup> quarterly cleanup was held in conjunction with FoLAR's (the Friends of the Los Angeles River) annual *La Gran Limpieza - the Great Los Angeles River Cleanup*. This river cleanup is something that is very near and dear to all of us at WANA. Our Vice-President **Joan Greenwood** served many years as a board member for FoLAR and has been the Willow Street Estuary Site Captain almost every year since 1995 when she took over from Jim and Nina Danza; WANA Treasurer **Nancy Risch** has been the Regional Cleanup coordinator for the southern most river sites for the past 11 years; and, from 2000-2004, I was the event coordinator for all of the dozen or so locations along the entire 52 miles of the River.

The May cleanup brought out 150 volunteers who did a magnificent job of picking up all sorts of trash. While I was down in the riverbed cleaning, I witnessed the enthusiasm of volunteers who really seemed to be enjoying the experience. I spotted former Director for the El Dorado Nature Center Mary Blackburn; California Heights Neighborhood Association President John Royce; and WANA members Maria Norvell, who served as this year's site co-captain, Loren Patten and Victoria Reynafarje.




