Come one—come all—meet your neighbors, local officials, police and fire departments and enjoy a great evening of






The following activities and/or events will take place:




- Serve cookies, drinks, and cups of Blue Bell Homemade Vanilla Ice Cream, (partly donated by Blue Bell Ice Cream).

SHINE (Start Helping Impacted Neighborhoods Everywhere) was introduced to OakCliff Neighborhood Association residents during our August 12th meeting.
