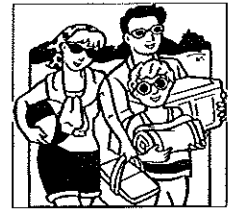

The following activities and/or events will take place:

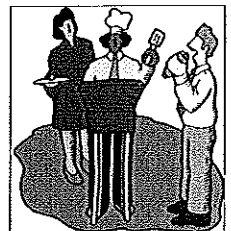
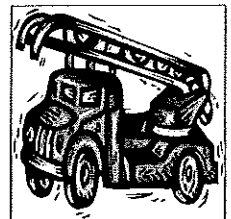
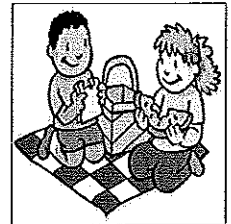


- Serve cookies, drinks, and cups of Blue Bell Home-made Vanilla Ice Cream, (partly donated by Blue Bell Ice Cream).

SHINE (*Start Helping Impacted Neighborhoods Everywhere*) was introduced to OakCliff Neighborhood Association residents during our August 12th meeting.

County Commissioner Brian Maughan of District 2 shared his vision of how neighborhood associations in District 2 could assist him and county government in

cleaning our city. Through the [SHINE] program, offenders who are sentenced to community service hours will be allowed to pay their debt to society as laborers on various projects targeted at beautifying neighborhoods throughout District 2. This will eventually work towards reducing property taxes since the offenders will operate as day laborers. We salute

Commissioner Maughan for his diligence, his vision, and his desire to see a better district. In addition to Commissioner Maughan attendance, State Representative, Richard Morrisette (District 92) attended the meeting and introduced the commissioner. 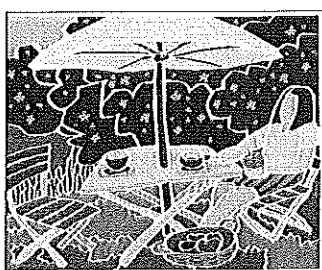

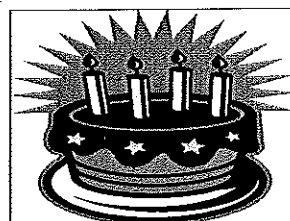

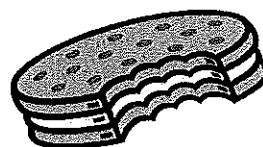
