


# The Dog Days of Summer are Nearly Gone.

# President's Corner

So, you've been wondering what we can do to protect our homes from burglars? Here's what we can do:

For starters, one of the easiest ways to protect your home is to make sure that all of the lights are working around the outside of your home - - and use them. Turn your porch lights on after dark - - your back porch and exterior garage lights, too. Ok, Bloomingdale, I'm going to repeat this one, "Please, turn on your porch lights after dark." Light up the neighborhood.


Another simple way to guard against burglary is keep your shrubbery and bushes trimmed below four (4) feet near all sidewalks and driveways. Consider planting thorny landscaping such as rose bushes beneath windows, but remember to keep them trimmed so they do not obstruct your view from inside your home.

According to the Fort Wayne Police Department, "Doors are usually the first choice of burglars. All exterior doors should be supplemented with a double cylinder deadbolt lock with a one (1) inch throw. Replace the locks that do not have a free rotating bevel beauty ring." Use your window locks or cut rods to length to use in your windows.


The Fort Wayne Police Department also recommends installing alarms if possible. In addition to these suggestions, ask close friends and neighbors to watch your home -and do the same for them.



#### PERSONAL SAFETY TIPS


Put your car keys beside your bed at night instead of putting them away by the door or other safe place. Most modern vehicles have some sort of security alarm which can be activated by using the buttons on the keychain. They can be used as a convenient security system that most people already own and requires no permanent installation. It will go off from most anywhere inside your home and will keep sounding until either the battery runs down or you reset it using the keychain.

If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your home the odds are the criminal will not stick around. The noise of the alarm tends to draw the attention of all the neighbors. Surely the criminal does not want to be seen.

Also remember to carry your keys while you walk to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can protect you in the same way. It could possibly save your life or protect you from a sexual abuse crime.

This could be useful for any emergency where you are unable to reach a phone like a heart attack. Another suggestion would be to carry your car keys with you in case of a fall outside where a spouse or companion cannot hear you. You can activate the car alarm to alert others to your problem.

  there, I unlatched the back window to make my return a little easier.
- 3. Love those flowers. That tells me you have taste ... And taste means there are nice things inside. Those yard toys your kids leave out always make me wonder what type of gaming system they have.
- 4. Yes, I really do look for newspapers piled up on the driveway. And I might leave a pizza flyer in your front door to see how long it takes you to remove it.
- 5. If it snows while you're out of town, get a neighbor to create car and foot tracks into the house. Virgin drifts in the driveway are a dead giveaway.
- 6. If decorative glass is part of your front entrance, do not let your alarm company install the control pad where I can see if it is set. That makes it too easy.

"Should I worry about ridges in my fingernails? Not if the ridges are vertical – those often appear as you get older, though no one is sure why. (Moisturizing nails may make the ridges less obvious.)
