Christmas Tree Lane Update: Wrigley Parade Saved!

Now ...


WANA members you just do not know how happy I am again. Our **Councilman James Johnson** has done it once again. This time, he saved this years Christmas Tree Lane Parade from the budget ax. He got together with Councilmen Neal and Andrews on how they could finance the 3 Parades — Daisy, MLK & Veterans by finding new revenue sources and reducing costs by 10% for each the Parades. James had help finding the additional funds to make up the City deficit. I want to thank everyone who was involved including our own **City Attorney Bob Shannon. Joan Greenwood** and I spoke at the budget hearing in front of the full Council. We spoke again at the budget hearing. **Jill Hill** joined us and also spoke on how important all the Parades were, especially (CTL). **Nancy Risch** had 37 of her neighbors sign a petition to keep the Parade, and I got signatures from 84 neighbors to sign it in support of the Parade. We were ready to put up a good argument on how important our historical and traditional Parade is to the Wrigley Community. See photos on page 5.

Councilman Johnson asked me if I could write a story about Christmas Tree Lane. As usual I got carried away and wrote more than there was space in the 7th District Newsletter. So, here's some of the history that was left out.

Over the years, several sponsors worked very hard with the City to keep the Parade going — **West Long Beach Lions Club** was the first — 1954 to 1977. (In 1976, does anyone remember Actor Rodney Allen Ripley? He was 8 years then, and he was in the Parade). The Parade died because of Proposition 13. In 1982, the **Downtown Kiwanis** and the **Wrigley Business Association** with help from the

City brought back some of the Parade. From 1988 to 1990, I was responsible for recruiting a series of sponsors for the Lane and Parade: **Downtown Kiwanis** (1988 to 1990), **Knights of Columbus** (1991 to 1992), **Free Masson Bixby Knolls Neptune Lodge #600-F&M**, (1993 to 1996). From 1996 to 2003, **Vanco Properties** led by its owner **Ed Van**, who also served as the President of the Magnolia Industrial Group (MIG), was the major community sponsor. They picked up barricades and "no Parking" signs from the City yard and placed them along the entire Parade route. After, Ed stepped down as President of MIG, his company continued to help with the Parade. There is so much to say. At a later date, I'll share even more history with you.
