



#### **COOPER NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME PREVENTION**



newsletter as I am changing patrol divisions

on August 30th. I hope you have found the information I have provided beneficial. In this article I thought I'd write about crime trends in your area since the first of the year.

This information is pulled from our department's COMPSTAT program. To include your neighborhood the geographic area I looked at was bounded between Garnett Road to 129 EA and Admiral Place to 21st Street. The following compares year-to-date 2009 with the same time period last year.

Burglary reports in the area are down 4% from last year. Burglary arrests are up 40%. Robberies are down 8%. Six arrests for robbery were made this year; none last year. Auto thefts are down by 16%. At least by this data you can easily see that by making arrests you can lower a crime rate. I do note that in the last 28 days there has been an up-tick in reported burglaries in the area. Many of these are daytime crimes so remember the tips from earlier; watch your streets and neighbor's homes and call us if anything is suspicious.

Lastly, school has started. So watch those crosswalks, bus stops and school zones!

I believe you will receive the same type of communication and service from the supervisors and squad coming in to your area at the end of August. It has been my pleasure providing information for your newsletter.

#### **COUNCILOR'S CORNER**

Hello, CNA.

We recognized one of own GREAT members at City Council a few weeks ago by presenting Mr. Tom McBay a proclamation for all his great work in CNA and District 6 and Tulsa. GREAT job, TOM, and THANK YOU and your family for what you have accomplished. You've MADE a difference in Tulsa and you have done it the right way, FROM YOUR HEART. We love you and Beth .... that's the good news :)

What's been going on in the past month or two in the City? We managed to pass a budget and, to say it was a normal thing, was an understatement. You're aware of Tulsa's tough times right now and people are wondering when we're going to recover. I'm like most of you, hopefully soon, but every day we hear about more layoffs and people being cut back on hours. The Council also passed a CDBG funding. That too was a struggle with so many good projects to fund and so little money to work with.

Elections (for Mayor and for City Council) are just around the corner. Sept. 8th is the primary date. The general election will be Nov. 10th. It's important for us to be involved and the primary is very important to District 6.... your district. Each party has a primary and the League of Women Voters will host a forum at Martin Regional Library on Sept. 1st. if you're not sure about the candidates you may want to be there to hear what we have to say and get to know us/them better. PLEASE do not take this lightly. If you are registered, take that couple of minutes to cast your vote.

The next couple of years are going to be very important to YOUR neighborhood and YOUR district. Fix Our Streets will get started in the next few months. You'll be able to follow the progress on line at cityoftulsa.org/fixourstreets. Also, remember it is a five-year program. CNA will be having some projects going on, but not every street will be repaired. The worst first.

CNA let me say again code enforcement is still a BIG item on your minds. Knocking doors in Cooper I've heard two things that you are most concerned about ... YOUR neighborhood and YOUR safety.

Cooper, we NEED to take care of COOPER. Nobody else is going too. YOU want to see things get better in CNA?? YOU NEED to be INVOLVED. You need to attend the meetings. You need to step up. Not only complain about things but also be part of the solution. HELP. You want code enforcement to be tougher? You need to help ... call 596-2100. You want tougher, better safety and stop crime? You need to watch out for your neighbor, get to know each other. There is no better place to get to know one another than by coming to YOUR neighborhood association meetings.
