Nancy Risch

I have lived in the Wrigley neighborhood since 1980, and I raised my son here. I was a volunteer for the Long Beach Unified School District when he was in elementary and middle school, and when he went to high school, I was the Poly High School's Baccalaureate Program chairperson for seven years; also, I was a part of the school site council for eight years. I was recognized as a community volunteer for improving the "quality of life" in 1999 by the 7th District councilmember Ray Grabinski, received a California

State Senate certificate of recognition for outstanding service as Wrigley Association President 2003-2004 from former State Senator Betty Karnette, and a Certificate of Appreciation for my support and involvement in the community presented at the City Council 7th District Recognition Ceremony in 2005. I have been a volunteer for FoLAR (Friends of the Los Angeles River) since the early 1990s and have been a region coordinator since 2001 responsible for the four sites here in Long Beach during the annual river clean-up.

I am one of the founding members of WANA. I have been on the board as the Treasurer since WANA began. I mail the newsletter to members each month and coordinate the distribution of our *News and Views* in the neighborhood. I have been part of the Code Enforcement committee since it began. I was part of the Long Beach Strategic Plan Committee for 2010. I am a volunteer for Cressa Park. I have been a volunteer for Christmas Tree Lane to help set-up and take-down the displays on the lane, help with the judging for the contest on Daisy, help with the entertainment nights, and help with the City sponsored parade since the early 1990s. I set-up the refreshment and information tables at our meetings.

Ken Gore and I have started a public relations committee, and we will deliver welcome baskets to the new home owners in Wrigley and invited them to the WANA meetings. I will encourage our members to bringing a neighbor with them to our WANA meetings, to start neighborhood watch programs, to report graffiti to the city's hot line, to help with code enforcement by reporting problem areas, and most important to ask our members to help by participating on a committee. I would like to continue to be a board member. I will continue to give my time and energy to support all of our activities.


