## **Neighborhood Watch**

What is neighborhood watch??? Neighborhood watch groups are the "eyes and ears" in the neighborhood for the police. Members keep an eye out in the neighborhood, watch out for each other, and report suspicious activities to the Sheriff's Department so they can investigate and take enforcement action, if warranted. It is not a vigilante group, and members do not take the law into their own hands or start making arrests.

The Sheriff's Department asks that 80% of the people in the block participate (each group can define how big the "block" is) with one person serving as the block captain. They also ask that members be willing to report crimes or suspicious activities. Lastly, they request that the block have one social event a year, which can be done in

Watch groups can be particularly effective in areas that are vulnerable to crime, such as the lake and picnic/playground area or the elementary school.

As a retired police officer, I know the value of watch groups in keeping a neighborhood safe from crime and giving residents peace of mind. Isn't it worth a little of your time to form a watch group on your block? Please contact me if you are interested.

### Clean up After Your Pet

Everyone is aware of the poor appearance of feces lying around on public park areas and local pedestrian trails, but aesthetics is just one reason for picking up after your pet. Unattended pet excrement kills grass with its high nitrogen content. Although nitrogen is a component of fertilizer, parks are already chemically fertilized,

component of fertilizer, parks are already chemically fertilized, and the additional fecal nitrogen has the effect of over fertilizing or "burning" the grass. Unsightly yellow and dead patches, coupled by foul smell, degrade park appearance and diminish enjoyment for other park users.

If degraded park appearance is not enough of a reason for you to clean up after your pet, be aware that pet feces have been linked to highly elevated levels of coliform and *Streptococci* bacterial pollution in storm runoff. It is possible for this runoff to contaminate drinking water, in turn, making people very sick. Additionally, bacterial-polluted runoff contributes to high nutrient levels in lakes and ponds. In late summer, these bacteria lead to algae blooms that rob oxygen from the water, killing the resident fish.

Several parasites are associated with pet fecal matter of which roundworm is the most common. This parasite can remain active for a many years, and persons who come in contact with the infected feces can become infected with the roundworm parasite. Contamination is possible if someone touches infected soil or old feces and transfers the eggs to their eyes or mouth. Those at greatest risk are young children because they are most likely to put things in their mouth.

Cleaning up after your pets, taking care to avoid dried feces, and washing with soap if you contact them are the best ways to stop the spread of these parasites. Pet defecation that is not appropriately disposed of can create some serious problems. So take a baggy along with you, a recycled newspaper bag works well, when you go to your local park or trail.

## Going Biking? Don't Forget Your Helmet

Before you climb on that bike, think about these statistics from the Bicycle Helmet Safety Institute:

- About 540,000 bicyclists visit emergency rooms with injuries every year. Of those, 67,000 have head injuries, and 27,000 have injuries serious enough to be hospitalized.
- One in eight cyclists with reported injuries had brain injuries. And two-thirds of the deaths reported were from traumatic brain injury.
- It is estimated that 45 percent to 88 percent of bicyclerelated brain injuries could be prevented by a helmet.
- In 2006, 770 bicyclists met their death on U.S. roads. More than 90 percent of them died in crashes with motor vehicles. The "typical" bicyclist killed by a car was a sober male of 16+ years who was not wearing a helmet while riding on a major road between intersections in an urban area on a summer evening.

## Happiness Is Catching

If you want to be happy, try getting close to other happy people. Happiness isn't just an experience or choice. It depends on how happy those directly and indirectly connected to you are, and requires close proximity in order to spread. For instance, if you have a happy friend who lives within a mile of you, you're 25 percent more likely to be happy yourself. Proximity is key: A person is 42 percent more likely to be happy if a friend who is happy lives less than half a mile away. The effect declines the farther away a happy friend is.

## Identity Thieves Lurk Everywhere

While we fret over the possibility of having our personal information stolen online, the truth is we're more likely to have our identities filched offline. Online identity theft methods constituted only 12 percent of fraud in cases where the victims knew how their identity was stolen, according to the "2008 Identity Fraud Survey Report" by Javelin Strategy & Research. The majority of cases of identity theft (79 percent) took place through traditional methods, such as stolen or lost wallets, checkbooks, credit cards, mail tampering, or "shoulder surfing"—where the thief looks over the shoulder of the victim at an ATM or cash register. Seventeen percent of the victims reported "friendly thefts"—those perpetrated by friends, family, or in-home employees.

Here are some tactics Javelin recommends for safeguarding your personal information and preventing identity theft:

- Password protect all your digital devices, including computers, PDAs, and mobile phones.
- Choose passwords and PINs that can't be easily guessed.
- Shred all documents that have personal information on them before disposing of them.
- Use a locked mailbox for incoming and outgoing mail.
- Monitor your online accounts frequently.
- Avoid mailing checks to pay bills or deposit funds. Move your financial transactions online.
- Review your credit information no less than once per year.
   To receive your free annual report from one or all of the national credit agencies, visit www.annualcreditre port.com or call 877-322-8228. Other methods of accessing your reports may charge a fee.
- Never provide personal information to anyone unless you initiated the contact.
- Install and regularly update firewall, antispyware, antivirus, and browser security software.
- When shopping online, check that you are using a reputable firm.
- Reduce access to your personal information wherever possible. Be aware of your surroundings when you conduct transactions in public.

## The (Genetically Altered) Color Purple

Anthocyanins are naturally occurring pigments in blackberries, cranberries, and chokeberries and are known to offer protection against certain cancers, cardiovascular diseases, and age-related degenerative diseases. Yet most people don't eat large quantities of these fruits. So scientists have been researching ways to elevate the levels of similar health-promoting compounds in the fruits and vegetables eaten more often by people.

Recently, snapdragon genes were successfully activated in tomato plants, hence creating purple tomatoes high in anthocyanins. When these purple tomatoes were used to supplement the diets of cancer-susceptible mice, the life spans of the mice were significantly extended as compared to a supplementation of

ordinary red tomatoes. Scientists hope to broaden this research so that common foods eaten by the general population can provide as many positive health effects as possible.


## A Look at a Younger Generation

It's easy to find headlines about teenagers who belong to gangs, or who were the cause of a tragic car accident, or who were arrested on drug charges. But there's at least one individual who has a ringside seat to the conduct of this younger generation: the high school principal. One such leader, Mike Buck, tells a story that didn't get any press:

"One of my students, who comes from a very poor socioeconomic background, found \$100 in cash. The girl immediately turned the money in to the front office. There was no hesitation, and there is no way anyone would have known if she kept the money for herself. I know the money would have meant a lot to this girl!

"We figured out who had lost the money: It was another girl who came from the same type of background as our good citizen. Why was she carrying so much cash? It was money she had worked for to pay for her senior cap, gown, and graduation invitations. This girl cried tears of joy when the money was returned.

"We see examples like this almost daily. It restores one's faith in the teenagers of today . . . our leaders of tomorrow."
