
Recycling took on a new face January 1, 2011 called single stream recycling. Our neighbors will not automatically receive the new two-

colored cart but will have to request one from the City. The City hopes to achieve around 65 percent, presently about 34 percent, participation. This is certainly achievable considering the number of brown and yellow containers sitting seen at the curbs in the past. They have found 96-gallon size rolling

container to be the best size. The 48gallon has proven too small even for a family of two.

Each container is equipped with RFID (radio frequency identification) to collect data on usage, theft, e.g. Whether this will bring the garbage cop to your door remains to be seen but it is a data collecting device.

There are three ways to report non-



**Pyrex and Anchor Hocking** dishes are not the quality of grandmother's. Consumer Report dedicated five pages of research in its January 2011 issue. Patricia Szczcenia of Lansing, IL stated she baked her ham at 350 degrees in a Pyrex glass baking dish. When she opened the oven door to baste the ham, she said, "The baking dish just Exploded."

To minimize the chances of the glassware shattering, consumers should read and save the safety instructions from their glass bakeware and follow these safety rules:

- Always place hot glassware on a dry, cloth potholder or towel.
- Never use glassware for stovetop cooking or under a broiler.
- Always allow the oven to fully preheat before placing the glassware in the oven.
- Always cover the bottom of the dish with liquid before cooking meat or vegetables.
- Don't add liquid to hot glassware.
- If you're using the dish in a microwave, do not use browning elements, and avoid overheating oil and butter.
- Do not take dishes directly from the freezer to the oven or vice versa.
- Never place hot glassware directly on a countertop (or smooth top), metal surface, on a damp towel, in the sink, or on a cold or wet surface.
- Inspect your dishes for chips, cracks, and scratches. Discard dishes with such damage.
- To avoid risks associated with glass dishes, consider using metal bakeware for conventional and convection ovens.





followed by <u>Choice</u>, <u>Select</u>, then Standard.

Make sure you check the price per pound or serving. The regular size is often cheaper then the family pack.

**Peanut Butter** may not be what it appears. "Peanut butter must contain 90% peanuts. (The rest can be sugar, salt, and oil.) Spreads contain less than 90 percent peanuts..." "One exception to the 90 percent rule is if a product is 90 % peanuts but contains ingredients that aren't allowed in peanut butter, such as artificial sweeteners or palm oil, it must be called a spread." It must be noted the number of neighbors driving the streets and alleys looking for A.J. was enormous; reflecting how nice Bloomingdale is to live in.


