WANA finally received an Executed Settlement Agreement on February 17, 2010. On May 10, 2010, certified copies of the Stipulation of Ownership and Order from the Superior Court of California arrived and, also, a Letter of Appreciation from our Attorney R.M. Anthony Cosio. Ownership has been our biggest challenge since WANA came into being.

Our second biggest challenge was to find storage for the displays. Thanks to our Councilman James Johnson, the City has secured warehouse space. Also, my thanks go to our City Manager Pat West for all his help in finding space. We have a lot of repair and restoration to do; the displays were out in the weather far too long in 2009. We probably will start renovation in March or early April. We were unable to remove the displays until January 13 because of all the rain. The ground was too soft and the fork-lift would get stuck and ruin the turf. Joan Greenwood and I delivered flyers on Sunday, January 2 to let the neighbors know about the delay.
