## Roof Rats Anyone?

Several neighbors have been bothered with these pests. There are apparently 2 different kinds of these animals – Norway rats and Roof rats. Roof rats, just like squirrels and raccoons, can scale most surfaces and may gain access by climbing up brick, stucco or wood siding. Roof Rats may also enter a home by finding an entry closer to the ground level. If a homeowner does not find an opening in the attic/roof area start checking lower to the ground level of your home. Recommended solutions for do-it-yourselfers:

- 2.) Tomcat's brand rat glue traps (<a href="http://tomcatbrand.com/product/15-rat-glue-traps">http://tomcatbrand.com/product/15-rat-glue-traps</a>)
