Candidate Forum Set for February - No regular JNA meeting

Candidates seeking election to District 7 will appear at a forum on Tuesday, February 22 starting at 6:30PM at Thomas Jefferson High School.

This forum is being co-hosted the by Jefferson. Donaldson Terrace, Inspiration H i 1 1 s Homes Association, Sunshine Estates, University Park and Monticello Neighborhood Associations.

Filing for the election, which will be held Saturday, May 14th, begins in March.

Early voting dates are May 2 thru May 10th, but early poling locations will be closed Sunday May 8th for Mother's Day.

Candidates who have announced so far include Chris Medina, Fred Rangel, Dr. Gloria Rodriguez and Elena Guajardo.

Persons wanting to

run for the council seat, being vacated by **Justin Rodriguez** because of term limits, have from February 14th thru March 14th to submit their application. The application packet costs \$25 and can be obtained in the city clerk's office.

Fire Department Gets High Marks

Results of a citizen's poll indicates that San Antonio residents are very happy with their public safety protection.

This includes the stations fire department.

At the January JNA meeting, Deputy Fire Chief **David E. Martinez** gave an overview of the department.

Martinez stated that there are 1058 fire fighters on the department's payroll. All of the firefighters are Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT). There are 392 paramedics in the department. They have more education than the EMT.

The city has 50 fire stations and 32 ambulances.

From 2005-2009, Falls were the number one reason for EMS calls and traffic accidents were the biggest reason for fire calls.

Station #1 is slated to become a museum in the near future according to Martinez.

Collection of **FY 2010-2011** dues has begun. If your mailing label has a "pd" symbol by your name, you're paid up for the new fiscal year.



Registration starts at 8AM with the clean up beginning at 9AM and running to noon.


This is the largest waterway clean-up in Texas.

Saturday, February 5, is Free Landfill Disposal Day for San Antonio residents from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Residents can take advantage of this opportunity to get rid of extra bulky items they may have lying around.

Participants must bring their most recent CPS Energy bill to show that they pay the City's residential solid waste fee along with a picture ID when dropping off items at one of the locations below.

Loads should be secured and covered in vehicles and trailers traveling to the landfill. Those individuals that do not cover their loads are in violation of a City Ordinance.

You're are encouraged to make the pledge to recycle and separate all items that can be reused. Items that can not be reused or


recycled should be brought to Landfill Disposal Day. No contractor, commercial, industrial, or hazardous waste will be accepted at this event.
