#### **NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH REPORT**

Prince George's County Police Department reported in November 2010, that there had only been two reported incidents of crime in Birchwood-Clearview during the reporting period. However, recently, there have been some home break-ins on Colony Road. The Police Department provided the following personal safety tips:

#### Safety at Home

- Lock doors and windows when you leave home--even for a few minutes.
- •Ask neighbors to watch your home and pick up your mail and newspaper when you leave home for extended periods.
- •Make sure your home appears occupied, day and night. Leave a radio or TV on when you are gone and keep several indoor lights on timers. Keep outside lights on all night.
- •Don't linger before entering your house; have your keys in your hand when you reach your house.

#### Safety in Your Car

- Lock your car after entering and exiting it. Park in well-lit areas.
- •Keep windows closed and doors locked while you are getting gas for your vehicle.
- •Check the car's front and back seats before getting in, even if your car was locked when you left it.
- •Don't linger before entering your car; have your keys in your hand when you reach your car.
- •Drive to the nearest open public place and blow your horn if you suspect someone is following you.
- •Don't warm your car unoccupied with the engine running and keys in the ignition.
- •Put packages in the trunk

#### Safety on the Street.

- •Use caution when walking alone especially when it is dark outside. If possible, walk with another person, or change your route to avoid isolated or dark areas.
- Be alert and aware of others on the street.
- •Cross the street or change directions if you suspect you are being followed and find the nearest occupied building or store.
- •Don't approach a car that follows you or stops near you to ask for directions.
- •Don't overload yourself with packages, books, purses, etc...

### Lt. JG La'Shanda Holmes is Coast Guard's First Black Female Helicopter Pilot

As reported by the <u>United States Coast Guard News</u>, the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) has appointed its first black female helicopter pilot. She is 25-year old La'Shanda Holmes. It is been said that she is an inspiration on USCG search and rescue missions in Southern California because of her achievement. Peers believe she will motivate others, especially minority girls, to aim for high achievements also. It is evidence from her background that if a young person wants to achieve, it is possible. Ms. Holmes mother died when La'Shanda was very young and she was then put in foster care. It was reported that Ms Holmes sometimes wondered what life had to offer and doubted what she was capable of, but she clung to her religious faith during these difficult times in an effort to persevere and go forward. She graduated as an honor student from her high school and attended Spelman College, one of the historically Black colleges in Atlanta, GA.
