Candidate Forum Well Attended

Four candidates seeking election to District 7 City Council appeared at a forum on Tuesday, February 22. The event was held at the Thomas Jefferson High School auditorium.

The forum was cohosted by the Jefferson, Donaldson Terrace and Monticello Park Neighborhood Associations.

A total of 13 questions were asked by the audience. Here's a rundown of those questions:

- 1. Would the candidate's support an ordinance concerning gender discrimination?
- 2.How would the candidates improve the user friendliness of the library system?
- 3.W hat is the candidate's stand on the

Woodlawn Lake Bridge?
4.W hat do the candidates feel about city staff and the city manager developing policy instead of city council?

5. Concerning conflict of interest issues, would the candidates recues themselves if such a conflict of interest arose?

6.How would you support the education initiative currently being proposed by the mayor?

7.How would you control the stray dog problem?

8.The outsourcing of jobs in the city doesn't create jobs. What's your opinion?

9. What can constituents in District 7 do to help the council person?

10.How will you respond to your

constituents?

11. What will you do about the drainage problems in the district?

12.How will you support the aging population in the district? Will you create senior centers similar to those in other city council districts?

13.What are your priorities in the upcoming proposed bond issue?

Filing for the election, which will be held Saturday, May 14th, has begun.

Persons wanting to run for the council seat, being vacated by Justin Rodriguez because of term limits, have from now thru March 14th to submit their application. The application packet costs \$25 and be can obtained in the city



The 5th Annual Great Texas Warrant Round-Up is underway through March 11.


The round-Up is a crackdown of people who have Active Warrants for Traffic Tickets and Ordinance Violations.

A grace period ended March 4 for persons to turn themselves in without the penalty of arrest.

From March 7th through the 11th, individuals will be rounded up and brought to the court to address their outstanding warrants before a Municipal Court Judge.



Lemonade Day Set for San Antonio

Get your dry whistle ready for "Lemonade Day" in San Antonio on May 1st.

This a community wide event to teach youth how to start and run their o w n businesses. Through this program, children l e a r n t h e skills entrepreneurial necessary successfully establish and operate a lemonade stand for one day.

As part of this effort, City Council waived the usual fees for temporary food booths and allowed some of the participants to set up at local parks.

Participants will be required to follow appropriate health regulations pertaining to proper food handling and will need to be supervised by an adult.

At the time of registration, a11 participants will be provided written information outlining Metro Health requirements, permitted parks locations, safety tips. In addition, this information will be provided on the City website.

In District 7, booths will be set up at Woodlawn Lake, Garza Park on Mira Vista, Sunset Park on Inspiration, and Falcone Park on Mystic Park.

Kids in Business Foundation (KIB), a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization, hopes to have 6500 participants this year.

How To Move A Mountain

I've been asked to discuss a few troubling aspects of our neighborhood and its relationship with the city.

The city seems to have lost some of the core responsibilities to the neighborhood. Those cores which are still rated high include:

- ✓ Providing security
- ✓ Providing waste management services.
- ✓ Providing a sustainable water supply.

Where the city has slipped is in the area of road maintenance.

While neighborhoods outside loop 410 North and Northwest enjoy fairly s m o o t h pavements, many of the roadways in the Jefferson area have fallen between the cracks (pun intended).

Babcock, from St. Cloud to Wilson is worse than third world.

Donaldson, from Quill to St. Cloud, is another example of deplorable pavement.

Dickinson, from Meredith to Babcock and Manor from Mulberry to Donaldson are some more disasters. Many of the less traveled streets running through the heart of the neighborhood aren't much better.

This has been a problem for a number of years.

Yes, there has been some reconstruction of streets, but even those are crumbling after a couple years of service.

In a neighborhood rich with tradition such as ours, this ongoing problem needs the attention only a city council person can provide. The **JNA** membership can complain, but it's the citv council representative who must stand and fight for the improvements.

On May 14th, the voters of District 7 will have an opportunity to elect another council representative.

Next time your car shakes, rattles, and rolls on our crummy streets, point your finger towards city council and demand action.
