

KaBOOM! Just like magic a new playground emerged in our **Wrigley neighborhood**. It is a park that will bring families and neighbors together to strengthen our relationships and pride in the community. However, it took more than magic to do the trick -- it took a lot of effort, hard work, funding and collaboration between the **Wrigley Area Neighborhood Alliance (WANA)**, **KaBOOM!**, **Long Beach Department of Parks**, **Recreation and Marine** and **Foresters** before the new park could be completed. Community volunteers pledged **420 hours** to install the playground and were led by **Community Development Advisory Commissioner** and **WANA Secretary Jill Hill**, who applied for the NPP grant and oversaw all aspects of the project from beginning to end.

The project – adjacent to the Los Angeles River at 2100 DeForest Avenue south of Hill Street -- was funded locally with a \$5,000 Neighborhood Partners Program grant. Partners of Parks donated a cash match of \$3,500. KaBOOM bought in additional resources including a corporate sponsorship from Foresters. The playground equipment is valued at over \$30,000 while volunteer hours and resources added another \$60,000.

Thursday, February 10, 2011 was Prep Day for the site. Approximately **30** volunteers from the City's Neighborhood Services Department and WANA worked for **nine** hours to complete the back breaking work of digging many holes for the equipment and fencing and setting the fence posts in concrete. Equipment and tools were contributed by **American Rentals and Coastline Equipment**, **CSC Targhee Environmental Consultants** provided a hearty breakfast and lunch for the Prep Day volunteers.

On Saturday, February 12, 2011, over **400** volunteers from near and far joined efforts to complete the playground to assemble the park in just **8** hours. Our major sponsor **Foresters** recruited **80** volunteers. Our City's Development Services Department recruited another 65. Neighborhood children painted mural art created and donated by local artists **Carlos Silveir** and **Greg Pickens**, trash containers, and tile mosaic stepping stones. Four bat houses were also installed at the playground. Lunch was provided by **Long Beach Police Department**, **Buono's Pizzeria** and **Chic-Fil-A**. Beverages & snacks were provided by **County Supervisor Don Knabe**, **Starbucks** and **Jet Blue**. City contractor **Waste Management** donated the dumpster and disposal services for making sure that all construction wastes were recycled. Paramount Petroleum provided reusable water bottles.

The event included appearances by Mayor Bob Foster, Councilmember James Johnson, Councilmember Dee Andrews, Assemblymember Bonnie Lowenthal, Police Chief Jim McDonnell, West Division Commander Josef Levy, City Prosecutor Doug Haubert, Director of Development Services Amy Bodek, Director of Code Enforcement Lei Ronca, Office of 4<sup>th</sup> District County Supervisor Don Knabe, and Office of Congresswoman Laura Richardson. Wrigley resident Christine Houston from the Port of Long Beach set up a Sustainability Wheel and collected pledges to "go green".

Thousands of children and their families in the neighborhood will benefit from this play area that was designed by local families and built by community volunteers. It will be a safe place for families to spend time together and get to know their neighbors. WANA is grateful for the opportunity to improve our neighborhood. Our thanks to the volunteers who contributed to this worthwhile and much-needed project. Special thanks to WANA's coordinating committee participants Natalie Rodriguez, Jim Trout, Vernon Rudd, Danielle Brown, Lillian Villa-Quintero, Joan Greenwood, Gina Quintero, Anna Mendiola & Maria Norvell.


