This is a very important committee because it plays a pivotal role in lives of our young people. The purpose of this committee is to study and report information on matters relating to education, including the area of scholarships (which includes the State Senatorial Scholarships). The Chairperson is requesting your help. A February 18, 2011 letter, to parents from PG County Schools Superintendent, William Hite, in response to County residents concerns about the potential increase in class sizes and the loss of some school programs, emphasized that the school system is facing a \$150 million budget deficit in FY 2012.

He advised parents to stay involved in the budget process by contacting their state elected officials and urging them to fully fund education. He also suggested that the parent visit website www.pgcps.org to obtain the latest updates on the school budget process.
