Welcome to 2010! Once again I would like to thank our dedicated crew of Monument Beach for their commitment and hard work in maintaining our beautiful village here in Bourne. Our volunteers are out there sprucing up the gardens, picking up discarded trash, and putting in several hours preparing and hosting our events.

In an effort to get more hands helping in our community garden, check out the schedule of Garden Days on the bulletin board at the M B post office. You may not realize that the gardens at the Post Office and train station are supported by volunteers and the Monument Beach Village Associates. MBCA

Landscaping Funds are used to purchase plants, soil and mulch; a small devoted crew keeps up with the weeding, planting, mulching and watering. It is through their efforts that our village gardens look so lovely. Please join us on one or two of those Garden Days to help us maintain our garden.

Last fall several residents approached our Board with a concern about the lack of access to our Beach. The Massachusetts Coastal Railroad installed a fence section at a path crossing near the dinghy rack and the Town of Bourne put up a "No Trespassing" sign on the gate that most would consider the walking entrance to the Beach. After several discussions with Town Officials and MCRR, it was resolved that the

Town would apply for a permit to have a legal RR crossing at the main gate. The Town Administrator and the Selectmen also said they would pursue an additional crossing at the north end of the fence near the dinghy rack.

We were pleased with the attendance at all our events in 2009, and we look forward to our upcoming season. You will find our events posted at the Monument Beach Post Office and as the date nears be sure to look for our signs highlighting the event, you can find them on Clay Pond Rd and at the train station. Beach Access

Town, state, railroad agree on rail crossing. A safe pedestrian crossing of the Buzzards Bay railroad bed off Shore Road, Monument Beach, may be in place by Memorial Day.

Town Administrator Thomas Guerino said there has been progress in talks with the Mass. Coastal Railroad and state transportation officials about a crossing. "To get a permanent crossing, we will need lighting and signaling and that will

represent a cost to the town," Guerino advised selectmen. "That may have to be a special Town Meeting article in May."

Monument Beach residents protested last year when Mass. Coastal blocked off pedestrian access to the sand at the village marina off Shore Road.

The rail company cited increasing train speed and the possibility of accidents along the tracks. The tracks accommodate the trash train each day bound

from Otis Air National Guard Base to SEMASS in Rochester.

Selectmen were persuaded to discuss the access issue with Mass Coastal, which relented on one crossing point outfitted for pedestrians and people in wheelchairs.

The crossing, once it is established and accepted by the state may prove more popular than ever this summer when Bourne Community Boating utilizes the nearby marina as its logistical base.


