

The proposed project involves upgrades to streetscape improvements, under the Restore Philadelphia Corridors and Hometown Streets programs. The project will be conducted along Germantown Avenue in two sections; from Seymour Street to Ashmead Street and from Walnut Lane to Johnson Street. The project includes replacement/addition of sidewalks, curbs, street trees, consolidation of signage, and lighting. The Home Town Streets/Safe Routes to School program initiative is intended to improve the quality of life and encourage reinvestment and redevelopment along the corridor. The project is being facilitated within the offices of the City of Philadelphia, Dept of Commerce and our City Councilwoman, Donna Reed-Miller.
