The Citizens Redistricting Commission is starting to travel around the state to take testimony from the public about their neighborhoods and communities. This is our chance to tell the commission about our Wrigley neighborhoods and where we want district lines drawn. The California Veterinary Medical Board joined forces with the California Spay and Neuter License Plate Fund to sponsor the program. Proceeds will provide funding for free and low-cost spay and neuter surgery programs across California and also will bring attention to the problem of homeless pets.

It's estimated that 1 million pets enter the state's animal shelters each year with more than half of them (500,000) being euthanized. 
