

With Shop QA you can go to one central location on the City website to search for local businesses. You will have the ability to print out coupons,

see menus, ask questions, determine store hours, join mailing lists, find business locations, "follow" local business and receive exclusive info on upcoming events and enewsletters. Not sure if your need can be filled by a local business? Just search the list of categories for a particular type of business to see what businesses can meet your need.

Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization dedicated to providing food relief and financial support to communities throughout the United States. The

program began in 1994 with 34 families in Monroe, Georgia (between Atlanta and Athens), and has grown to serve hundreds of thousands of families every month across 45 states.

Angel Food is available in a quantity that can fit into a medium-sized box at \$30 per unit. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists of both fresh and frozen items with an average retail value of approximately \$60. Comparison shopping has been done across the country in various communities using a wide range of retail grocery stores and has resulted in the same food items costing from between \$42 and \$78.

Generally, one unit of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week or a single senior citizen for almost a month. The food is all the same high quality one could purchase at a grocery store. There are no second-hand items, no damaged or out-dated goods, no dented cans without labels, no day-old breads and no produce that is almost too ripe.

Also offered are specialty boxes such as steaks, chicken and pork. Many participants in this bonus program appreciate the expanded choices. Additionally, there is no limit to the number of units or bonus foods an individual can receive, and there are no applications to complete or qualifications to which participants must adhere. Angel Food Ministries also participates in the U.S. Food Stamp program, using the Off-Line Food Stamp Voucher system.

Orders are taken at Faubion United Methodist Church (West entrance) from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday except when the church office is closed for holidays. If you wish to order through the church, you must do so in person and pay for the food at the time of ordering with either cash or Food Stamps. No checks or credit cards are accepted under any circumstances.

If you are not able to order in person, you may order online at www.angelfoodministries.com. You will collect your food order once a month on Saturday morning. Please contact the church office (816-436-1882) to verify pickup times.

You should bring a large container (box, cooler, or laundry basket) to take your order home. Since much of the food is frozen, Faubion United Methodist Church does not have facilities to keep the food. Therefore, any food not picked up during the pick-up times will be donated to the Metropolitan Lutheran Ministries food pantry.

There are no qualifications, minimums, income restrictions, or applications. Everyone is encouraged to participate. If you aren't interested but don't have a way to get to the church to make your payment or pick-up your order one of our neighbors has volunteered to transport you to the church. If you need transportation help, please call Julie or Mark Sherbo at 816-436-3070.



Gladstone Public Works

The City of Gladstone offers residents the opportunity to dispose of trash, debris and bulky items during its annual Beautification weekend. Household hazardous waste, commercial waste and yard waste are not accepted during this event. Beautification is usually scheduled for the last weekend in April. In addition to Beautification, the City also offers two yard waste disposal events during the year. At these events, residents may only dispose of grass, leaves, tree limbs and brush.
