# **GREETINGS FROM NORTH GLEN SQUARE'S PRESIDENT**

North Glen Square receives a grant through the City of Phoenix Block Watch Grant program to help pay to send the newsletter to the whole neighborhood on a monthly basis. ### TRANSIENTS IN PARKS

Due to a recent influx of transient population returning to west side city parks, another phase of Operation Night Sweep was launched. Community Action Officers Joe Trujillo and James McPheeters reinstated this enforcement concept to retarget the previous six area parks: Cielito Park, La Pradera park, Homestead park, Mariposa park, Little Canyon park and Washington park. Cactus Park Precinct Community Action Squad and 91 Area patrol is working in partnership with representatives from the City Prosecutor's Office, Neighborhood Services, and local drug rehabilitation centers in coordinating efforts.

### **THE SOLUTION TO GRAFFITI BEGINS WITH YOU!!**

### Watch and report suspicious activity

Much of the graffiti comes from teenage "taggers" not necessarily afflilated with gangs. The thrill is simply

To see your scrawling, or "tag" posted all over the community. If you see a teen lurking around after dusk with a backpack, they may not be returning home from a chemistry study session. Chances are that backpack

Is stuffed with spray paint and magic markers. Report any suspicious activity to the Phoenix Police department immediately, at 602-262-6151.

### If you have teenagers, watch for signs

Tagging on school folders and backpacks full of markers and paints may mean that your teen is engaged in tagging. It's important to know that your parents may be cited if their children are caught tagging. Also, schools in our community frequently photograph and document "tags" that show up not just on school property, but on student assignments that are turned in to teachers. This provides an easy cross-reference for catching taggers, and it's very effective.

#### **Inspect your neighborhood**

Be aware and keep your eyes open. Monitor block walls, light posts, and traffic signs as you drive, bike or

Walk around the neighborhood.

Remove graffiti immediately—it begins with YOU!!

The fastest way to remove graffiti is to take care of your adjacent area and remove it immediately. Get your neighbors involved and form your own neighborhood graffiti patrol team. These small "neighborhood graffiti

Removal teams" have been very effective, particularly in the northwest part of NGS along 35th and Northern Avenues. FREE paint (in desert tan, cement gray, desert rose and white), rollers, and "Hilti" spray solvent(for traffic signs, and so easy to use) are provided by the city of Phoenix, by calling Lydia at 602-534-1489, or by visiting their warehouse at 64 North 48th Avenue. TIP: wet rollers can be placed in zip-lock bags for reuse later. Also, taking a digital photo of the graffiti before you cover it may help in the prosecution of the tagger should he or she end up being caught.

If self-removal is not possible, and you have been unable to motivate your neighbors to join you in your efforts, you have two options. Option#1: Call the city's graffiti buster hotline at 602-495-7014. Removal time can take up to four weeks.

Option#2: Contact the North Glen Graffiti Committee by email at northglengraffiti@yahoo.com or leave a detailed message with Jon at 602-354-5096.

Remember—calling the NGS Graffiti Committee does not ensure immediate removal. The committee will put your graffiti on a removal list, which will be forwarded to the Crossroads Community—our neighborhood partners. And don't forget, We are all volunteers with jobs and families, so please be patient. Thank you for your help! Jon Vreeken

The City of Phoenix Graffiti Program, along with neighborhood groups and many other organizations, are attempting to remove graffiti within 24 to 48 hours. By signing this permission slip and returning it promptly, you are helping to keep our community and the city graffiti free.

**PROPERTY OWNER:** The city of Phoenix has a program designed to remove graffiti from various surfaces. By signing this petition, you will be granting permission to the City of Phoenix Paint Team to remove graffiti from your property. This service is **FREE** to you, but you must own the property or have legal authority to grant permission. **This permission is valid until revoked in writing.**

### DISPOSE OF TRASH PROPERLY

An accumulation of trash and debris detract from the appearance of properties and neighborhoods. Using designated trash containers, recycle bins, quarterly trash pick-up and conducting neighborhood clean-ups are good ways to keep neighborhoods well maintained.

### REMOVE VISIBLE OUTDOOR STORAGE

Keep properties free of visible outdoor storage of household items, building or landscaping materials, appliances, parts or other items. Place all items that can be seen from off the property in an enclosed storage area, or consider donating items that are no longer needed or holding an annual neighborhood yard sale to clear out excess storage.

### REMOVE INOPERABLE VEHICLES

Inoperable vehicles visually detract from community appearance. Consider donating inoperable vehicles to charity organizations. Many of these organizations provide a tax benefit for donated vehicles.

### MAINTAIN VEGETATION

Keeping properties and adjacent alleys, streets and sidewalks free of tall weeds/grass and dead or dried vegetation enchances the appearance of a neighborhood. It also prevents fire hazards. Having a regular property maintenance schedule helps keep properties clean. Planting low-maintenance, low-water use vegetation can also reduce maintenance time and save water.

# SPRING TIME SAFETY TIPS

Spring time is right around the corner, which means warmer, enjoyable weather is soon to come. During this time of year, we find ourselves outside more often doing yard work, watching the kids play ball or just hanging out with friends and family. Our spring temperatures usually means more people have their windows and doors open, taking pleasure in the fresh air, and dreading the day they have to turn on their air conditioner.

Enjoying the weather does not mean you need to sacrifice your home safety. I want to discuss with you some safety tips that will allow you to enjoy spring temperatures while still keeping your family and home safe.

Let's begin with your garage. You should never keep your garage door open for long periods of time, especially if you are not outside to monitor what is occurring. Too often, criminals drive through neighborhoods looking for open garage doors with no one around. All they have to do is walk up, take your golf clubs, lawn mower, bicycle,etc., and drive away. It only takes seconds for your property to become theirs. Keep your garage door closed and always keep the door between your garage and home locked. If it only takes seconds for a thief to steal your property inside your garage, how long do you think it takes to steal what they want from inside your house? Keep your family safe by keeping the gobetween door locked.

If you are one of those people who likes having the windows and screen doors open, take some precautions. Similar to the garage door theory, do not leave your windows and doors open if you are not going to be home, not even a little bit! An open window or door to an empty home is an invitation to a burglar. If you leave your house, even for a short time, ensure all the windows and doors are closed and locked. If you want to leave your windows open while you sleep, it is best to close those windows on the opposite side of the house from where you are. If no one is in those rooms, close and lock the windows so no one breaks in while you and your family are sleeping.

Walk around and observe the plants and shrubs around your house. Are they overgrown? Can they easily conceal someone hiding in them? Do they block your front door? If you answered yes to one or more of these questions, you should consider trimming them, or removing them. Remember, it's spring time and a time for new beginnings. Trim the plants, cut down the hedges or maybe remove some of the shrubs that could aid a burglar.

Keep you and your family safe this spring, and throughout the rest of the year, by taking a few extra precautions around the house. Pass these tips on to your family and friends, and they too can enjoy the wonderful temperatures without becoming a victim. Have a great season and be safe !!

Neighbors should be able to see the front of your house, both doors and windows, and you should be able to clearly see out to the street.


### Criminals seek concealment when entering your house!

Bushes should be trimmed below window level

Tree branches should be 6-7 feet from the ground

Front yard shrubs cut to 36"

Consider planting thorny plants under windows and around fences. Cactus, Roses, Bougainvillea, Pyracantha
